NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, FOUND AND DETERMINED by said City Council that, after taking the steps provided by Section 2 of said Act above referred to, it is the initial view of this Council that the contemplated improvement described in said Resolution No. 2457 above referred to is one in which the probable assessments will not exceed the limitations set up by said Act above referred to;



RESOLUTION NO. 2457

RESOLUTION OF PRELIMINARY DETERMINATION OF LEGISLATIVE BODY
UNDER "SPECIAL ASSESSMENT INVESTIGATION, LIMITATION AND
MAJORITY PROTEST ACT OF 1931" NO. 2457

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that certain improvements are proposed to be done and made within the boundaries of the proposed assessment district hereinafter described.

In connection therewith, said City Council hereby finds and determines as follows, to-wit:

1. That the nature of the proposed improvement and the location and extent thereof consists of improving "v" STREET, from the easterly line of 45th Street, to the westerly line of 48th Street; by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curbs and gutters; installing cast iron gutter drains; reconstructing existing concrete manhole; grading; and constructing an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half ($5\frac{1}{2}$) inches in thickness.

2. The boundaries of the district of lands proposed to be specially assessed to pay the costs and expenses of such proposed work and improvement are generally defined as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on the northwest corner of Lot 2836 "Elmhurst" (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California); thence easterly along the northerly lines of Lots 2836 to 2819, both inclusive, in said tract, to the westerly line of 48th Street; thence southerly on the westerly line of 48th Street and the same produced southerly, to a point 90 feet south of the southerly line of "v" Street; thence westerly on a line parallel to the southerly line of "v" Street and 90 feet distant therefrom measured at right angles, to a point where the easterly line of 45th Street would intersect if produced southerly; thence northerly on the southerly projection of the easterly line of 45th

Street, and the easterly line of 45th Street, to the point of beginning.

3. That the amount and portion of the cost of such proposed improvement proposed to be paid by the City of Sacramento from any source other than special assessments upon benefited property is nil.

4. The statute under which it is proposed to conduct proceedings for the proposed improvement is the "Improvement Act of 1911," approved April 7, 1911, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto; with bonds to be issued as authorized under the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915," approved June 11, 1915, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five (5%) per cent per annum; and

~~BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Engineer is hereby directed to prepare for this Council a written Report upon the proposed improvement, such Report to contain all the information required by Section 3 of the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931," approved June 8, 1931, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto.~~



RESOLUTION APPROVING MAP AND DIAGRAM NO. 2457



in the City of Sacramento, be, and the same is, hereby approved.


