

Updated Code for: Residential & Commercial Solid Waste Construction & Demolition Special Events Food Vending

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- ▶ 2016 - SB1383 signed into law establishing methane emissions reduction targets to reduce short-lived climate pollutants in sectors of the economy
- ▶ Sweeping law that touches all things waste and beyond
- ▶ Jurisdiction required to have code updated and in alignment with SB1383 and state regulations.
- ▶ Third update to code since 2020.

SB1383 - Short-lived Climate Pollution Reduction Law

Food Vending Vehicles

Ch 5.68

- Must have both mixed and organic recycling along with garbage containers.
- Separated waste goes back to their Commissary Kitchen
- When part of big event - cannot be the only source for organic waste disposal

Construction & Demolition

Ch 8.124

- Updated diversion rate for C&D to 65% to 50% per CalGreen regulations (building standards) -already implemented.

Special Events

Ch 12.48



Events must have both mixed and organic recycling along with garbage.
Containers are co-located



Events with 500+ will need a waste plan as part of the city permit.



Events of 2,000+ require a post report to CalRecycle. (AB 2176)



Waste requirements for events now under RSW - with more detail to meet SB1383.

Residential Solid Waste - Ch 13.10

- ▶ Inspection authority of residential containers clarified for SB1383 compliance
- ▶ Container storage revised - more flexible
- ▶ Authority to adjust service levels and apply exemptions within SB1383 limitations & set minimum rates for services
- ▶ Codify Junk Pickup appointment timeframe
- ▶ Create one article in code to address organic waste - combining yard waste and food waste sections.

Commercial Solid Waste - Ch 13.24

- ▶ Aligning with County Code
- ▶ Codifying minimum service levels for organics and mixed recycling
- ▶ Customer Service improvements
 - ▶ Timelines for reasonable response to customers, request service changes, copies of contract
- ▶ Franchise fee use for landfill operations fair share & illegal dumping



Timeframe

▶ 2022

- ▶ November - Draft Code to Stakeholders
- ▶ December - Input from Stakeholders
- ▶ March - City Attorney Review

▶ 2023

- ▶ September - Second draft to Stakeholders
- ▶ October 17th - Law & Legislation
- ▶ November 14th - Pass for Publication
- ▶ November 28th - Adoption
