Recommendation: Adopt a Resolution: 1) authorizing the City Manager or the City Manager's designee to transfer \$425,000 (Storm Drainage Fund, Fund 6011) from available fund balance to the expenditure budget of the Bridge/Floodgate Maintenance Program (R15192300); 2) authorizing the City Manager or the City Manager's designee to transfer \$290,000 (Major Street Construction, Fund 2007) from available fund balance to the expenditure budget of the Bridge/Floodgate Maintenance Program (R15192300); 3) authorizing the City Manager or the City Manager's designee to execute Supplemental Agreement No. 4 to City Agreement No. PRC000501 with Mead and Hunt, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$36,408, for a new total notto-exceed amount of \$284,895; and 4) resetting the City Manager's authority to issue supplemental agreements for City Agreement No. PRC000501.

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Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: The City's Floodgate Maintenance Program is intended to address ongoing repair, replacement, and operations of the City's floodgates, including improvements and a comprehensive program with a manual designed to protect the safety of City staff, complete periodic inspections and reporting, and provide engineering support for floodgate repairs. This program will also provide a summary of recommendations, design details, and specifications for necessary maintenance and repairs on the primary levee floodgates.

The Primary Levee Rehabilitation Project will provide the necessary maintenance and repairs on the primary levee floodgates as recommended by the Floodgate Operations and Maintenance Program. Mead and Hunt, Inc. was awarded a contract to develop the Floodgate Operations and Maintenance Manual. A corresponding supplemental agreement with Mead and Hunt, Inc. is required to provide additional engineering oversight and construction support for the ongoing Primary Levee Rehabilitation Project.

Concurrent with this effort, the City is in the process of implementing the recommendations from the *Secondary Levee Evaluation* prepared for the Department of Utilities. One of the recommendations from this evaluation was to construct a floodwall on the southside of the Capital City Freeway/Business 80 (State Route 51) between the UPRR tracks and the American River. Caltrans plans to initiate a project in Spring 2022, so the City has a limited opportunity to incorporate this effort into Caltrans' project. To meet this schedule, the City initiated the work by retaining the services of Wood Rodgers and Stantec from existing on-call lists to evaluate the feasibility of incorporating this improvement with a pending Caltrans project for structural retrofits to the American River State Route 51 Bridge. Transferring \$715,000 in funding will allow the City to complete environmental and design for this effort in order for it to be incorporated with Caltrans' work schedule.

Policy Considerations: This project is consistent with the General Plan goals to enhance the pedestrian and vehicular facilities in the public right-of-way and to improve public safety.

Economic Impacts: None.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): Approval of the supplemental agreement constitutes an administrative action that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the built environment, and the action is not a project that requires environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). See CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(5). The budgetary adjustments are intended to

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review and determine environmental effects and take any necessary action to replacing a planned retaining wall on State Route 51 with a flood wall.

Sustainability: With climate change, potential flooding risks increase as seasonal weather events become more severe. This project will help take action to ensure that City residents and property and evacuation routes are better protected in the event of flooding.

Commission/Committee Action: None

Rationale for Recommendation: Approval of Supplemental Agreement No. 4 with Mead and Hunt, Inc. will enable the City to complete the construction of the of the Primary Levee Rehabilitation Project including all of the required design oversight and input during construction. Approval of the budget transfers will allow for completion of environmental and design for a flood wall on the Capital City freeway (State Route 51). Resetting administrative authority will allow for increases on contracts to keep work progressing and avoiding delays.

Financial Considerations: The total estimated cost for the initial work for the flood wall on State Route 51 is \$850,000, with that funding to be shared between transportation funding and storm drainage funding. With the transfer of \$425,000 from the available fund balance of the Storm Drainage Fund (Fund 6011) and an additional \$290,000 from the available fund balance of the Major Street Construction Fund (Fund 2007), there will be sufficient funding to complete the environmental and design work. After estimates are completed, the City and Caltrans will determine how to fund the construction costs.

There is sufficient funding remaining within the Bridge/Floodgate Maintenance Program (R15192300) to execute Supplemental Agreement No. 4 with Mead and Hunt, Inc. in the amount of \$36,408 and cover remaining project related costs.

There are sufficient funds within the Storm Drainage Fund (Fund 6011) and the Major Street Construction (Fund 2007) available fund balances to complete the recommended transfers.

There are no General Funds allocated for this project.

Local Business Enterprise (LBE): Mead and Hunt, Inc. is a local business enterprise.

Background: Large portions of the City are surrounded by levees which protect the community from flooding from the Sacramento River, American River, and smaller tributaries. Primary levees are those that are a community's primary defense against river floods.

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Sacramento's primary levees run along the Sacramento River, American River, Sacramento Deep Water Channel, Dry Creek, Robla Creek, and Arcade Creek.

The primary levees in Sacramento are punctuated by transportation crossings such as roads and railroads. Closure structures are erected at each of these crossings when flood levels are expected to rise above the level of the crossing. Such crossings vary depending on their location and era of construction. These floodgates are crucial to the City's flood management system because they allow vital road and railroad facilities that cross the City's flood protection levees to operate continuously.

The City of Sacramento Department of Public Works maintains and operates most of the floodgates that protect the City. Mead and Hunt, Inc. was hired to perform field inspections of operation, condition assessments, structural analysis, and to create an Operation and Maintenance Manual for the floodgates the City maintains.

A similar study was prepared for the Department of Utilities in 2020 to evaluate the City's secondary levee system. The secondary levee system was constructed in the 1850's and was the original flood protection for the City until what is now the primary levee system was constructed in the early 1900's. This study determined that the City's secondary levee system could provide viable flood protection to the City with recommendations on potential upgrades to the system.

One of the recommendations from the study was to construct a floodwall on the southside of Business 80 between the UPRR tracks and the American River. If the southern primary levee system were to ever fail upstream of the American River Business 80 Bridge, this would provide passive flood protection for Downtown Sacramento without the need to close Business 80 to erect an existing flood gate. This would allow the City to keep Business 80 open as a possible evacuation route in the event of a significant flood event.

Caltrans is currently retrofitting the American River Capital City Freeway/Business 80 (State Route 51) Bridge with plans to construct a retaining wall in the location of the proposed flood wall. The City has partnered with Caltrans to evaluate the feasibility of constructing a floodwall in this location in lieu of a retaining wall. If it proves to be feasible, design plans and environmental clearance will be provided to Caltrans for inclusion with their project. Wood Rodgers and Stantec were selected from the City's on-call lists to provide design and environmental services, respectively. Once designed, the net additional costs for constructing the floodwall will be identified and the City and Caltrans will need to negotiate on how to cover any increase project costs.

BUDGETARY ADJUSTMENTS AND SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT: BRIDGE/FLOODGATE MAINTENANCE PROGRAM (R15192300)

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento's Department of Public Works maintains and operates most of the floodgates in the floodgate system that protect the City. The Primary Levee Floodgate Rehabilitation Project will implement the recommended maintenance, repairs, and improvements for all the floodgates on the primary levee system.
- B. A Request for Proposals was advertised, and Mead & Hunt was selected to provide the Floodgate Operations and Maintenance Manual Program.
- C. Concurrent with this effort, the City is in the process of implementing the recommendations of the Secondary Levee Evaluation prepared for the Department of Utilities which identified improvements to the secondary levee system.
- D. One of the recommendations from this study was to construct a floodwall on the southside of the Capital City Freeway/Business 80 (State Route 51) between the UPRR tracks and the American River. Caltrans is currently retrofitting the American River Bridge with plans to construct a retaining wall in the location of the proposed flood wall. The City has partnered with Caltrans to evaluate the feasibility of constructing a floodwall in this location in lieu of a retaining wall.
- E. The City has retained the services of Wood Rodgers and Stantec from existing on-call lists to evaluate the feasibility of incorporating this improvement with the Caltrans project to retrofit the American River State Route 51 Bridge. If it proves to be feasible, design plans and environmental clearance will be provided to Caltrans for inclusion with their project.
- F. Budgetary transfers are needed to fully fund the supplemental agreement with Mead and Hunt and to study the feasibility of the State Route 51 flood wall.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to transfer

\$425,000 (Storm Drainage Fund, Fund 6011) from available fund balance to the expenditure budget of the Bridge/Floodgate Maintenance Program (R15192300).

- Section 2. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to transfer \$290,000 (Major Street Construction, Fund 2007) from available fund balance to the expenditure budget of the Bridge/Floodgate Maintenance Program (R15192300).
- Section 3. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to execute Supplemental Agreement No. 4 to City Agreement No. PRC000501 with Mead and Hunt, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$36,408, for a new total not- to- exceed amount of \$284,895.
- Section 4. The City Manager's authority to issue supplemental agreements for City Agreement No. PRC000501 is reset.

1 SCOPE

The Services specified in the Scope of Services Exhibit of the Contract are amended and the Contractor shall provide the Services as set forth in Exhibit 1 to the Scope of Services Exhibit, attached and incorporated herein.

2 TIME OF PERFORMANCE

The Time of Performance for the Contract is extended for an additional 12 month period from August 27, 2021 through August 27 2022.

3 CONTRACT AMOUNT

In consideration of the Contract Amendment(s) described above, the maximum not-to-exceed amount that is specified in the Contract is increased by \$36,408, and the Contract's maximum not-to-exceed amount is amended as follows:

The original Contract sum was: \$233,487.00

The net change by previous Contract Amendment was: \$15,000 The Contract sum prior to this Contract Amendment was: \$248,487

The Contract sum will be INCREASED by this Contract Amendment: \$36,408

The new Contract sum including all Contract Amendments: \$284,895

Contractor agrees that the amount of increase or decrease in the not-to-exceed amount specified in section, above, shall constitute full compensation for the additional and/or revised Services specified in section, above, and shall fully compensate Contractor for

The above-referenced PROJECT requires an Amendment. The work in this Amendment is in addition to the Scope of Services stated in the original CONTRACT between the CLIENT, City of Sacramento, Department of Public Works, and the CONSULTANT, Mead & Hunt, Inc., dated September 12, 2019.

The CLIENT agrees that the CONSULTANT shall provide professional consulting services for the PROJECT as set forth in this Amendment and the CLIENT shall provide payment for those services as provided for in this Amendment.

A detailed description of our understanding of the Amended PROJECT Scope of Services, Schedule, and Compensation is provided below.

Reason for Amendment

The purpose of this amendment is to provide additional engineering support and project management in response to construction activities related to the PROJECT.

Amended Scope of Services

The Scope of Services for the PROJECT, Task 3.2 - Provide Engineering Assistance Repairs, is amended as follows and Mead & Hunt will provide the following services:

- Additional Contractor Submittal Reviews (up to five) provide engineering technical review and recommendations for up to five additional contractor submittals
- Additional site visits (two) provide field oversight and engineering support for two additional site visits in order to support PROJECT construction activities
- Additional Del Paso Floodgate Trial Closure (one) provide field oversight and engineering support for one additional trial closure for the Del Paso Floodgate
- Develop As-Built Plans develop as-built drawings for the PROJECT
- Additional Project Management and Coordination provide continuing support, team communication and coordination to support the PROJECT
- Optional Additional task to obtain three-dimensional (3D) measurement data for the Del Paso Floodgate - subconsultant to complete Lidar 3D scan of the Del Paso Floodgate's center seals

and jambs and process data that Mead & Hunt can use to provide the City with exhibits of gate existing conditions

Amended Schedule

Mead & Hunt proposes the following revised dates to complete the work for this PROJECT:

Extend CONTRACT term by one (1) year (from August 27, 2021 to August 27, 2022).

Amended Compensation

Form of compensation for work in this Amendment will be in accordance with the *Terms and Conditions* of the existing CONTRACT, dated September 12, 2019. The City of Sacramento, Department of Public Works will pay Mead & Hunt an increase of \$36,408 for the work performed under this Amendment, including an optional task described herein, which results in a revised contract amount of \$284,895 for the total PROJECT. In the event the City does not wish to complete the optional task, the contract increase for this Amendment would be \$26,802 and would result in a revised contract amount of \$275,289 for the total PROJECT.

See **Exhibit 1** for Amendment 2 PROJECT costs. Exhibit 1 replaces Drake Hughes with Thomas Darlington and an Engineering Technician I was added to provide drafting services. Additionally, **Exhibit 1** utilizes Mead & Hunt's 2021 Standard Billing Rates, attached as **Exhibit 2**.

Amendment Assumptions

In addition to those responsibilities listed in the original CONTRACT and previous amendments (if applicable), this Amendment is based on the following assumptions:

- Any additional work, not included in the above scope or as described in assumptions below, will require an additional PROJECT amendment
- Additional contractor submittals will not exceed five (5)
- Two additional site visits will be required, to support construction activities
- One additional trial gate closure will be required
- Project management and coordination includes limited budget for team meetings and coordination
- The City of Sacramento, Department of Public Works will provide Mead & Hunt with a complete
 and accurate set of construction redlines to complete the PROJECT as-built plans
- The City of Sacramento, Department of Public Works will provide coatings thickness measurements for the Del Paso Floodgate
- The City of Sacramento will remove existing rejected plastic lumber from the Del Paso Floodgate's seals and jambs in advance of optional 3D data collection (optional task)
- Work included under this Amendment exclude any potential re-design or plan modifications that
 may result in the change in the PROJECT's contractor, as a result of PROJECT construction
 activities
