

RESOLUTION No. 37

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of
April 3rd, 1930

WHEREAS, the Pacific Gas and Electric Company has applied to the Railroad Commission of the State of California to establish rates for the distribution of natural gas in the City of Sacramento and other places in its vicinity; and

WHEREAS, the proposed schedule of rates as filed by said Pacific Gas and Electric Company includes a service charge of seventy five cents (75¢) per month and appears, in other respects, unjust and inequitable,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Manager and City Attorney of the City of Sacramento be authorized and directed to appear at all hearings of the Railroad Commission and endeavor, by all proper means, to secure an alteration in said proposed schedule of rates and to inquire into the relative merits and justice of service charge and minimum charges to the small consumer of limited means to the end that rates may be established which are just both to the citizens of this city and the said corporation.
