Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: Every 10 years, after the US Census Bureau counts all residents, the City of Sacramento must reestablish council districts boundaries to reflect changes in population. Pursuant to a voter-approved charter measure in 2016, there are now 15 (13 voting members, and 2 alternates) community members serving on the City of Sacramento Independent Redistricting Commission (SIRC), which is solely responsible for adopting a new council-district boundary map.

Under Sacramento City Charter section 176, the commission must hold at least eight public meetings, including one public meeting in each existing council district, prior to adopting a final map.

Town Hall Community meetings will be held in each council district to:

- Provide a platform to engage the community in a meaningful and impactful way about decisions that affect them by eliminating barriers; and to
- Develop and foster an environment of trust and confidence between the community, stakeholders, and commissioners.

Listening sessions will be held in each council district to share information about the redistricting process and to collect input from members of the public. The listening sessions are intended to engage and educate.
