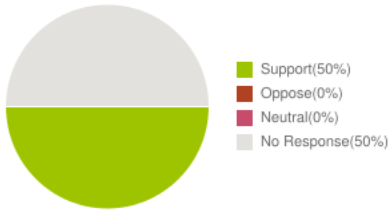

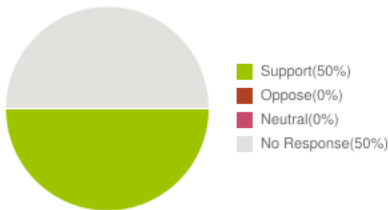

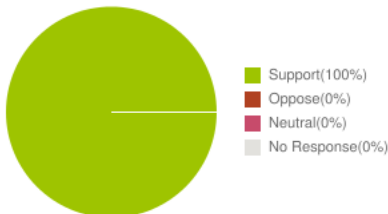

Tax paying and law abiding citizens such as myself are frustrated to no end by the lack of transparency from constituents who see their communities succumbing to urban blight, decreased public safety and severe environmental offenses caused by homeless communities that remain untouched by city and law officials.
