North Sacramento School

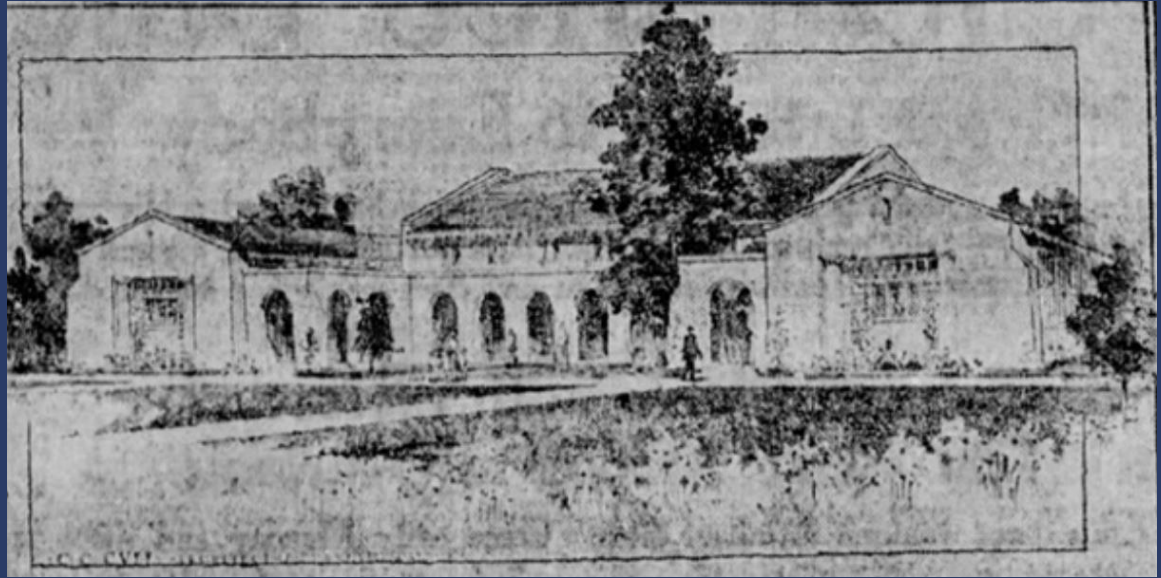
- Built 1915 – several additions between 1920 and 1947
- School building
- Located in North Sacramento
- Three criteria of significance
- Listed on the National Register in 2021

Contributions to the broad patterns
of the city's history

- Associated with the growth of the City of North Sacramento
- Community hub
- Served as a driver of population growth
- Additions to the building indicative of rapid growth

Distinctive characteristics and style

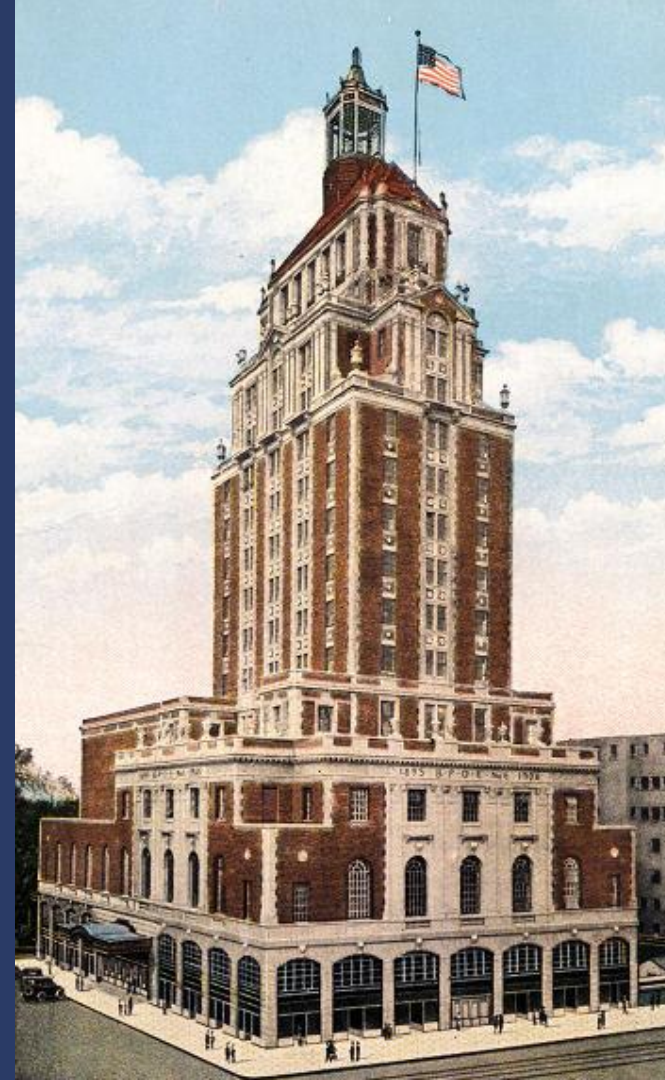
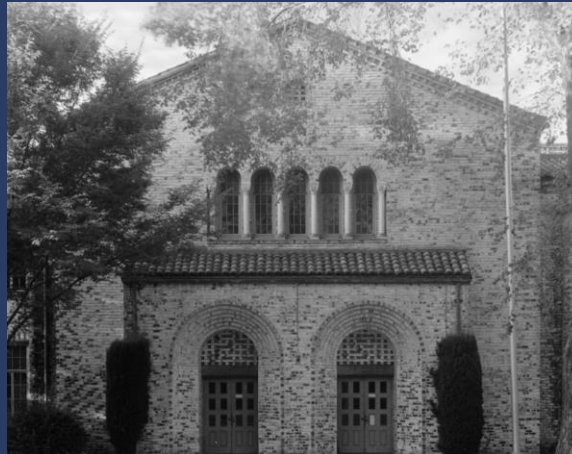
- Mission-Revival educational architecture
- Spanish Colonial and Romanesque Revival elements
- Design elements: Clay tile roof, fluted columns, smooth stucco, arcade, buttresses, projecting wings, parapets, courtyard
