

# RESOLUTION No. 132

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

May 4th, 1933

WHEREAS, reports have come to this Council that the natural gas furnished to citizens of Sacramento by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company is inferior in heating qualities to that promised when the interim rate was fixed by the Railroad Commission nearly two years ago; and

WHEREAS, there is a report that marsh gas has been mixed with the natural gas; and


WHEREAS, complaints have been made by citizens to City Officials that gas bills this Spring have not decreased correspondingly with decrease in use of gas,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Railroad Commission be, and it is hereby, asked to direct said Company to furnish to our citizens natural gas of the quality so promised;

That the said Commission determine, if possible, whether an inferior quality of gas has been furnished and, if so, that the said company be ordered to make a compensating rebate to its Sacramento City customers;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Council commends said Commission for its initiative in inquiring into alleged excessive rates for natural gas; that this Council believes that said rates are excessive and urges that same be reduced, if, after the hearing now conducted, it is found that said company is receiving a larger return than is received by business in general.
