Grant: Fiscal Year 2024/25 Office of Traffic Safety Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP)

BACKGROUND

- A. The California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) has awarded \$400,000 to the Sacramento Police Department in federal grant funding to participate in the FY2024/25 Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP). The term of this grant is for one federal fiscal year, beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025. The grant will support services/supplies, travel/training, and overtime activities related to general traffic safety, illegal street racing/sideshows, and driving-under-the-influence (DUI) enforcement and education.
- B. The primary purpose of this grant is to "reduce the number of persons killed and injured in crashes involving alcohol and other primary collision factors" by implementing "best practice strategies" including, but not limited to enforcement and education efforts focused on general traffic safety, DUI, distracted driving, sideshow/street racing, and motorcyclist, pedestrian, and bicyclist safety issues.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.

The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to accept the grant award of \$400,000 from the California Office of Traffic Safety.

SECTION 2.

The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to execute the FY2024/25 STEP grant agreement.

SECTION 3.

The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to establish the FY2024/25 STEP operating grant (G11016225).

SECTION 4.

The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to increase the operating grant revenue and expenditure budgets by \$400,000.
