## RESOLUTION No. 385

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

**DECEMBER 27, 1956** 

WHEREAS, the Honorable MALCOLM C. GLENN will soon retire from service as Superior Court Judge for Sacramento County and we deem it right and proper that the Council of the City of Sacramento express its appreciation for his honorable and upright public service to the people of this community and state.

Judge Glenn was admitted to the practice of law in 1901. He engaged in the practice of law in Sacramento until 1907 when he was appointed deputy Attorney General for the State of California, which position he served with distinction until the year 1914, when he was appointed by the former Governor, Hiram Johnson, to the office of Superior Court Judge for California, to serve in Sacramento County.

As judge, he has served the people for 42 years. If one word could describe his judicial life, it would be the word "integrity".

Judge Glenn presided over the Criminal Department of the Sacramento Courts for a number of years. He always stood firmly for law enforcement, without fear or favor, thus giving protection to the people against the criminal element.

In his administration of the domestic laws it is well known that he has opposed the separation of parents and children; that divorce in this court has not been looked upon lightly.

Regardless of the importance or seeming importance of the litigants, as well as their attorneys, Judge Glenn has brought to his work detailed and methodical study of the facts and law of every case, and his decisions represent the result of much care and research.

With it all, Judge Glenn has not forgotten the proneness of people to err and make mistakes. Where possible he has tempered justice with mercy; he has interpreted the law with a view that has helped the oppressed, the widows and orphans. He has been a humane and honest judge.

Judge Glenn has also been active in the civic life of this community and in this sphere he has contributed much. The community is proud of his personal and family life.

THEREFORE, we extend to Judge Malcolm C. Glenn and his family the season's greetings and our best wishes for a long continued, useful and happy life in our community, and we also extend our thanks to him for his many years of fine and honorable public service to the people.
