

## Description/Analysis

**Issue:** The El Camino Avenue Sidewalk Improvements Project (T15116300) will provide pedestrian improvements along El Camino Avenue between Evergreen Street and Clay Street.

The establishment of this Capital Improvement Project and the transfer of funds are necessary for the preparation of the environmental documentation and final design of the project.

**Policy Considerations:** This project is in accordance with the City Operating Principles of promoting safety and enhancing livability and sustainability.

### Environmental Considerations:

**California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA):** The establishment of a CIP and transfer of funds are not subject to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Under CEQA general rule 15061-B-3, CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. These actions will have no effect on the environment, thus are not subject to CEQA.

**Sustainability Considerations:** This project is consistent with Sustainability Master Plan goals of enhancing the pedestrian facilities in the public right-of-way, reducing dependence on the private automobile, and encouraging pedestrian trips.

**Other:** None.

**Commission/Committee Action:** None

**Rationale for Recommendation:** The City has an obligation to provide pedestrian improvements to enhance the public right-of-way and to increase safety. The establishment of a Capital Improvement Project and transfer of funds are necessary to pursue this project.

**Financial Considerations:** The design and environmental phase of the El Camino Avenue Sidewalk Improvements Project (T15116300) will be funded with \$149,667 (Fund 3004) of District 2 Community Reinvestment Capital Improvement Program (CRCIP) funds. Additional funding from the Pedestrian Improvement Program (T15075200) will be transferred at a later time for the construction phase. There are no general funds planned or allocated for this project.

**Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD):** None, since no goods or services are being procured with this action.
