

## THE HONORABLE CITY COMMISSION,

CITY OF SACRAMENTO,

MARCH 31st, 1921.

The Honorable City Commission met in Regular Session on this date at 10.15 o'clock A. M., President Bliss presiding.

Roll Call was answered by following Commissioners:

Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Carmichael, Haynes, Turner.

The Minutes of Adjourned Meeting of March 25th, 1921, Special Meeting of March 26th, 1921, were read and approved.

At request of City Clerk the reading of Minutes of Regular Meeting of March 29th, 1921, and Minutes of Finance Committee of March 29th, 1921 was dispensed with.

----- Joe Vezzanori addressed Commission requesting free peddlers license on account of being afflicted with paralysis. Referred to Commissioner of Public Health and Safety.

----- Clyde H. Brand addressed Commission requesting the establishment of electrolier lighting district in West Curtis Oaks with Marbelite standard for electroliers.

Commissioner Brown stated that Marbelite standard installed on 38th Street was chipping and cracking, and C. W. Longton, Agent of Marbelite Company addressed Commission on subject matter.

J. W. Haley and A. H. Moeller addressed Commission requesting action on installation of electroliers on 12th Street from B to L Street.

Commissioner Brown stated that resolution would be presented shortly, and C. W. Beaton, City Electrician stated that he would present report to Commissioner of Public Works at his request, relative to comparative cost of arc lighting and lighting of electroliers.

Commissioner Carmichael thereupon moved that the matter be referred to Commissioner of Public Works for full report at Meeting of April 5th, 1921. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes and carried by following vote:

----- Commissioner of Streets presented private contract between McGillivray Construction Company and Carl Koch, C. H. Burnett and Catherine A. Sullivan, for improvement of Santa Inez Way, from the southerly line of J Street to the northerly line of K Street, K street from the westerly line of Santa Inez Way to the easterly line of 36th Street, and 36th Street from the southerly line of J Street to the northerly line of K Street.

Commissioner Carmichael moved that private contract be approved. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes and carried by following vote:

----- Commissioner of Streets presented private contract between F. E. Provost and Carl Koch G. H. Burnett and Catherine A. Sullivan for construction of concrete curbs and gutters and concrete sidewalks and cast iron gutter drains on Santa Inez Way from the southerly line of J Street to the northerly line of K Street and 36th Street from the southerly line of J Street to the northerly line of K Street, and K Street from the westerly line of Santa Inez Way to the easterly line of 36th Street.

Commissioner Carmichael moved that private contract be approved. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes and carried by following vote:

--- A petition was received from T. S. Greer requesting Pool Room license for premises 2655 Sacramento Boulevard. Referred to Commissioner of Public Health and Safety.

----- City Clerk reported that no bids had been received for the purchase of bonds issued for the improvement of Y Street from the easterly line of 34th Street to the westerly line of Santa Cruz Way.

Commissioner Carmichael thereupon introduced the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, no bids were received for the sale of the bonds issued for the improvement of Y Street, in the City of Sacramento, from the easterly line of 34th Street to the westerly line of Santa Cruz Way,

Gentlemen:

I hereby present the following charges against E. B. Harris, member of the Police Department of the City of Sacramento, which charges, if true, show E. B. Harris to have been guilty of conduct unbecoming a police officer and will justify the expulsion of said E. B. Harris from the services of the City of Sacramento.

1. That on or about the 11th day of June 1920, said E. B. Harris was accused by one Argante of having solicited said Argante to pay said E. B. Harris the sum of \$20.00 in consideration of which the said E. B. Harris agreed to notify the said Argante when Prohibition Enforcement Officers were in Sacramento. That an indictment was returned by the Grand Jury of Sacramento County against the said E. B. Harris charging him with the crime of attempted extortion by reason of said demand. That upon the trial of said E. B. Harris, the said Argante, under oath, testified to the foregoing facts; and thereupon and without putting said defendant upon his defense, the Court instructed the jury to find the defendant not guilty, which was done. However, the defendant has not denied under oath the facts set forth in the charge of said Argante, and even if said charge did not constitute a public offense, I charge that the acts of said E. B. Harris in soliciting said money for the purpose stated by said Argante constituted and does constitute conduct unbecoming a police officer and was a violation of his duty as an officer of the law.

2. I am investigating other accusations made against said E. B. Harris and if I find that the facts justify charges upon said ground, I will file supplemental charges for your consideration.

Sirs:

Relative to the claim of Dr. George E. Chappell, which was referred to this Department of February 17th, 1921, I beg to report that I have thoroughly investigated this claim and find that fireman, Clarence Butler, was with ex-chief Anderson on April 27th, 1920 at the time the Chief sustained the injuries that in a great measure has permanently incapacitated him. That Butler was injured at the same time and was taken to the Krull hospital, where he remained two days attended by Dr. Chappell. The claim of Krull Hospital for hospital dues, dressing, and medicine, \$6.60 was paid on May 18th, 1920.

In my opinion this is a just and legal claim against the City and I recommend that the same be paid.

Sirs:

Relative to the two bills of the American-La France Engine Co., which were referred to this Department on March 8th, 1921, I beg to report as follows:

These bills were contracted by the Chief of the Fire Department:- one, on October 30, 1918 covering - 1 Hilliard Spring \$ 1.37  
1 Tungar Rectifier 30.00 \$31.37

the other on September 20th, 1919, covering 1 shifting rod guide and Nut \$4.50.

These bills were originally incurred by the Chief of the Fire Department, in an irregular manner, by purchasing the same direct from the American-La France Fire Engine Co., instead of thro the Purchasing Agent of the City, as provided for by the Charter, and the present attempt to pay the bills by issuing confirmatory requisitions and redating the bills is as great an evil as was done originally; for not only would such procedure fail in its purpose to correct an error, but it would add thereto another error by paying for these goods out of the appropriation for this year (1921) when they should and must be paid out of the Reserve Funds of the years in which the indebtedness was created.

The investigation of these claims disclosed the fact that the globe of the Rectifier was broken the first day of its use and the use of the apparatus was then abandoned, subsequently the globe was replaced and the apparatus is now in daily use in the Fire Department charging batteries;

That the old clutch spring which was to be returned, for credit was held as a reserve for use in an emergency; and

That the Shifting rod guide and nut were used by the Fire Dept.

Now therefore, inasmuch as the City of Sacramento has used and has benefitted by these articles and the irregularity in ordering same should not in justice reflect on the merchant, I recommend that these bills be paid, and out of the reserve of 1920, which includes and holds within itself the reserves of 1918 and 1919, the years when such indebtedness was incurred.

And in connection with this matter, I wish again to severely condemn the action of any City Official buying anything at anytime, without the consent of the City Commission, except through the Purchasing Agent and then only in cases of extreme urgency, and if the practice is persisted in the offending official should be punished by being compelled to assume the indebtedness.

Commissioner Turner reported that the Board of Governors in Recreation Center No. 1 were to take over furniture and that Community Service Club mentioned had been maintained by funds obtained by outside forces, and that it was possible to maintain said club as an auxiliary to Recreation Center No. 1.

----- Commissioner of Public Health and Safety recommended acceptance of bid of Betz & Mabrey for second alterations to former E. B. Crocker home and Art Gallery in sum of \$14,367.00.

Commissioner Haynes moved that recommendation be adopted, and that bid of Betz & Mabrey in sum of \$14,367.00 be accepted, money to be taken from Crocker Art Gallery Fund. Seconded by Commissioner Brown and carried by following vote:

Extra switches and starting compensator, on hand at Sump # 2, may be used, if necessary, thus making the cost of installation less than anticipated.

The P. G. & E. Company will install the transformers Ect., without cost to the City.

The cost of electric power will amount to about \$2700.00 per month, operating 12 to 14 hours per day, pumping at the rate of 15 M. G. in 24 hours.

In the event that authority to proceed with this installation is given, it is requested that the parties furnishing the pump and motor be requested to use every effort for an early delivery.

This equipment will be urgently needed at the very earliest period.

Dear Sir:

Upon discussing the matter of the installation of 712 HP at your plant with Mr. Gillespie he asked that we advise you as to your requirements in connection with the expense of the installation.

We find that the transformers and cable are available from our stock and owing to this we are very glad to advise you that all necessary equipment for supplying you the service which included transformers, switches, and meters will be installed at our expense. It will, however, be necessary for you to run your wires from the transformers to your switches which operate the pump. It will also be necessary for you to supply us with approximately ten gallons of water per minute together with piping for the same as the transformers are of the water cooled type.

In a former communication which Mr. Gillespie wrote us, he advised that it would be quite a convenience to you for us to provide transformers from which half voltage could be supplied for the purpose of starting the motor. The transformers which we have in mind will supply you with this voltage, but will necessitate your running three additional wires from your pump switch to the transformers in order to obtain this voltage.

Our part of the above work can be done inside of three weeks at most, so we would appreciate your advising us sufficiently ahead of time to enable our completing the work before you are ready for the service.

The above confirms conversation between our Mr. Tobey and yourselves.


