

HONORABLE CITY COMMISSION,

CITY OF SACRAMENTO

JUNE 7th, 1921.

The Honorable City Commission met in Regular Session on this date at 10.30 o'clock A.M., with President Bliss presiding, and Roll Call being answered by the following Commissioners:

Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Haynes, Turner.

Absent: Commissioner Carmichael.

----- Minutes of Regular & Finance Meetings May 24th, 1921, Regular May 26th, and Regular & Finance May 31st, 1921, were read and approved.

----- At request of City Clerk, reading of minutes of Regular Meeting June 2nd, 1921, was dispensed with.

----- Tim Ansoch, representative of Independent Garbage Company, addressed Commission stating that Company had taken charge of the removal and disposal of garbage, that five wagons had been utilized in district I to L Streets, with three five (5) ton trucks and one Ford Auto, and with 16 vehicles in all being utilized at present time in removal of garbage; that 75 men had been employed, and that by date of June 9th, the Company expected to be in a good position to removed all garbage in the City of Sacramento.

Commissioner Bliss stated that the garbage conditions were being handled in excellent manner, complaints had ceased, and that, in his opinion, the situation would be in good condition in a few days.

----- A. S. Dudley, Secretary-Manager of Chamber of Commerce, addressed Commission requesting re-lighting of street lamp at 13th & I Streets, and matter was referred to Commissioner of Public Works.

----- An amended petition was received from Pacific Gas & Electric Company, requesting a Special revocable permit to conduct one (1) man cars in the City of Sacramento on G Street, 10th Street and T Street lines. Ordered filed.

Commissioner Brown moved that petition be referred to Commissioner of Public Works for report. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

----- RESOLUTION OF AWARD, No. 1511

RESOLVED, that the City Commission of the City of Sacramento, having in open session on the 7th day of June, 1921, opened, examined and publicly declared all sealed proposals or bids offered for the following street work to be done in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the Improvement Act of 1911, approved April 7th, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, to-wit:

Improving 32nd Street in the City of Sacramento from the southerly line of L Street to the northerly line of Folsom Boulevard, by removing and disposing of all refuse and surplus material, constructing concrete curb and gutter on official line and grade where the same does not exist on official line and grade, placing cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to sewer with six (6) inch vitrified ironstone sewer pipe, constructing two (2) concrete manholes complete with cast iron curbs and covers, constructing eight (8) inch vitrified ironstone pipe sewer connecting manholes to sewer, grading the roadway and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half (5½) inches in thickness.

Improving M Street in the City of Sacramento from the easterly line of 32nd Street to the westerly line of 33rd Street by removing and disposing of all refuse and surplus material, constructing concrete curb and gutter on official line and grade where the same does not exist on official line and grade, constructing one (1) concrete manhole complete with cast iron curb and cover, constructing eight (8) inch vitrified ironstone pipe sewer connecting manhole to sewer, grading the roadway and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half (5½) inches in thickness. Improving L Street in the City of Sacramento from the westerly line of 32nd Street to the westerly line of 33rd Street by removing and disposing of all refuse and surplus material, constructing concrete curb and gutter on official line and grade where the same does not exist on official line and grade, constructing one (1) concrete manhole complete with cast iron curb and cover, placing cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to sewer with six (6) inch vitrified ironstone sewer pipe constructing an eight (8) inch vitrified ironstone pipe sewer connecting manhole to sewer, grading the roadway and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half (5½) inches in thickness. All of said work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the Superintendent of Streets.

RESOLUTION OF AWARD NO. 1516.

RESOLVED, that the City Commission of the City of Sacramento, having in open session on the 7th day of June, 1921, opened, examined and publicly declared all sealed proposals or bids offered for the following street work to be done in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the Improvement Act of 1911, approved April 7th, 1911, and the several acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, to-wit:

- Improving W Street, in the City of Sacramento, from the easterly line of 31st Street to the westerly line of 34th Street, by removing and disposing of all refuse and surplus material, constructing concrete curbs and gutters on official line and grade where the same do not exist on official line and grade, placing cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to sewer with six (6) inch vitrified ironstone sewer pipe; constructing two (2) concrete manholes complete with cast iron curbs and covers, constructing an eight (8) inch vitrified ironstone pipe sewer connecting manhole to manhole, grading the roadway and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half (5½) inches in thickness. Excepting from the above all work already done to the official line and grade.

Improving 31st Street, in the City of Sacramento, from the northerly line of W Street, produced easterly, to the southerly line of W Street, produced westerly, by removing and disposing of all refuse and surplus material, constructing concrete curbs and gutters on official line and grade where the same do not exist on official line and grade, placing cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to sewer with six (6) inch vitrified ironstone sewer pipe, reconstructing one existing concrete manhole by placing same to official grade, grading the roadway and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half (5½) inches in thickness. Improving the alley first south of 12th Avenue, in the City of Sacramento, from the manhole in place in 33rd Street to a point 30 feet east of the east line of 32nd Street, by excavating a trench and constructing therein a vitrified ironstone pipe sewer with nine (9) vitrified ironstone wye branches attached, constructing one (1) concrete manhole complete with cast iron curb and cover; and one (1) six (6) inch vitrified ironstone flusher branch; and,

Improving the alley between 32nd and 33rd Street, in the City of Sacramento, from the center line of the alley first south of 12th Avenue to the north line of 14th Avenue by excavating a trench and constructing therein a vitrified ironstone pipe sewer with twenty (20) vitrified ironstone wye branches attached, and constructing one (1) six (6) inch vitrified ironstone flusher branch, and backfilling the trench.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the Superintendent of Streets.

That the costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be chargeable and charged upon the district of lands herein described, which is hereby declared to be the district benefited by said work and improvement, and which is to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof. RESOLVED, that the public interest and convenience require, and the City Commission of the City of Sacramento hereby orders the following street work to be done in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the Improvement Act of 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, to-wit:

Improving 5th Avenue, in the City of Sacramento, from the easterly line of Sacramento Boulevard, to the westerly line of 42nd Street, by removing and disposing of all refuse and surplus material, constructing concrete curb and gutter on official line and grade where the same does not exist on official line and grade; placing eighteen (18) cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to sewer with six (6) inch vitrified ironstone sewer pipe; constructing four (4) concrete manholes complete with cast iron curbs and covers; reconstructing six (6) existing manholes by placing to grade; grading the roadway and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half (5½) inches in thickness.

----- Before adjournment, Commission carefully compared bids received on this date with record of same kept by City Clerk, and found record and bids to be similar in every respect.


