**SUBJECT:** Approval of Reimbursement Agreement For Camden Passage, Improvement Proceeding No. 5162

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Attached is a Resolution authorizing the City Manager and City Clerk to execute a Reimbursement Agreement between the City of Sacramento and Underwood-Wiese Company for the City Contribution for extra width street section required for Riverside Boulevard, in the construction of street improvements for Camden Passage. The work will be done by the developer's work force.

Riverside Boulevard is a major arterial and calls for City participation in it's construction. The City's share for constructing Riverside Boulevard, based on the bid prices, is \$20,159.20.

### FINANCIAL DATA

Funds for the City's portion (\$20,159.20) will be paid out of the City Engineer's Budget No. 2-09-2600-2463-4820 when the funds become available and according to where this particular project appears on the priority list established by the City Engineer.
