

ORDINANCE NO. 999,  
FOURTH SERIES

An Ordinance Prohibiting Idling or Loitering in Public Places; Prohibiting Letting of Room or Rooms for Disorderly Purposes; Providing a Penalty Therefor, and Making This Ordinance an Emergency Measure to Take Effect Immediately.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1. No person shall hire and/or use any apartment, room, or tenement for the purpose of assignation or prostitution. No person shall let any apartment, room or tenement, knowing, and/or under such circumstance that should cause a person of reasonable understanding to know that it is to be used for the purpose of assignation or prostitution.

SECTION 2. No dissolute women or other disreputable person shall stroll or loiter about any street, alley, wharf, depot, or other public place, or solicit prostitution upon any such place.

SECTION 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail not to exceed six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 4. WHEREAS, the immediate operation of the provisions of this ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the City Council and its publication as required by law.


