Subject: Sacramento Softball Complex Fund-Raiser

SUMMARY

This report recommends that the City enters into an agreement with the Greater Sacramento Softball Association, a non-profit organization, for the purpose of conducting a one-year fund-raising effort in support of the Sacramento Softball Complex to be located in Del Paso Regional Park.

BACKGROUND

The Greater Sacramento Softball Association is a local body of the Amateur Softball Association and a non-profit support organization of the Department of Parks and Community Services.

In July of 1983 the City of Sacramento entered into an agreement with the Sacramento Junior Chamber of Commerce to develop and establish a fund-raising effort for the proposed softball complex in Del Paso Regional Park. The City budgeted \$5,000.00 to assist in the development of fund-raising materials. In January 1985, the Parks and Community Services Department received a letter from the JayCeers terminating the agreement; it stated that the Sacramento JayCeers are very supportive of the project but didn't feel that its organization could fulfill its obligation. No funds have been expended.

The Department of Parks and Community Services recommends that the Greater Sacramento Softball Association conduct the fund-raising project and utilize the \$5,000.00 currently budgeted. The funds would be spent on a reimbursable basis for materials and publication related to the fund-raising project.

RECOMMENDATION


