SUMMARY

The California Integrated Waste Management Board is accepting applications for non-discretionary grants for the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Program. The non-discretionary grant is an award to reimburse a jurisdiction for an HHW program that was implemented in FY 1990-1991. A grant application will be prepared by Solid Waste Division staff for submittal to the California Integrated Waste Management Board.

COMMITTEE ACTION

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that Council adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to submit a grant application to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for reimbursement of HHW collection expenses in FY 1990-1991.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City of Sacramento conducts periodic HHW collection events to facilitate the recycling and disposal of household hazardous waste. These events are conducted in cooperation with the County of Sacramento.

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The California Integrated Waste Management Board began operation of a grants program to partially reimburse cities and counties for City Council HHW collection costs. The City of Sacramento Solid Waste Division submitted an application for approval on October 25, 1990. The City of Sacramento was subsequently awarded a HHW Non-discretionary Grant of \$52,167.00 (on May 24, 1991) as partial reimbursement for costs associated with the HHW collection (toxic event) program, implemented in the FY 1989-1990. This grant program is now entering its second year. Grant applications are due on September 27. Funds are scheduled to be awarded by January 31, 1992.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The City of Sacramento has budgeted \$343,000 in the Solid Waste Division Operating Budget to pay for hazardous waste collection and disposal during FY 1991-92. Any monies received from this grant will be used to offset the increasing costs of HHW collection.


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Applications for grant funding to pursue programs such as HHW collection is consistent with Council policy to divert toxic materials from the City's landfill. The Solid Waste Division will continue to apply for such funding as it becomes available.
