

RESOLUTION NO.

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF

RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING WILHELM BERGER

IT IS HEREBY NOTED that the people of this City suffered a great loss in the passing of Wilhelm Berger on the 14th day of October, at the age of 60, in Sacramento, California.

WHEREAS, Wilhelm "Bill" Berger, a native of Vienna, Austria escaped to the United States the night after he watched Adolf Hitler march into that city in 1938 to become a 46-year Sacramento resident; he belonged to the Mosaic Law Congregation, David Lubin Lodge, B'nai B'rith, and B'nai Israel Congregation, and served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War, II; and,

WHEREAS, Wilhelm Berger was the founder of Commonwealth Equity Trust, and chairman of the board of B and B Property Investment Development and Management Company, Inc. serving as investment adviser; and,

WHEREAS, this Council believes it proper that its minutes and the official records of the City recognize the passing of Wilhelm Berger, and so, has caused this Resolution to be prepared.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED that this Resolution be entered with the minutes of this meeting, in addition to which, this meeting shall be adjourned in respect for the memory of Wilhelm Berger.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitably engrossed copy of this Resolution be tendered to Joyce Berger, bereaved wife, as an expression of this Council's deepest sympathy.
