Recognizing Hawaiian Airlines

WHEREAS, beginning June 7, 2002, Hawaiian Airlines will expand the connection of Northern California with the beautiful Hawaiian Islands by initiating daily nonstop flights to Honolulu from Sacramento International Airport; and

WHEREAS, Sacramento is the capital of the most populous state, while Honolulu is the capital of the most popular vacationing state; and

WHEREAS, the first person to leave Sacramento for Hawaii was Mark Twain, whose reports from "the Sandwich Islands" were, and continue to be, greatly admired and travelers can follow Twain's footsteps in the comfort of one of the world's highest ranked airlines for award-winning service; and

WHEREAS, Hawaiian Airlines, founded 72 years ago, is Hawaii's largest and longest serving airline, renowned as "The Wings of the Islands" and is also the nation's 12th largest airline and second-largest provider of passenger service between the West Coast and Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, the people of the Sacramento region and the state of Hawaii can look forward to closer ties, expanded business, and improved travel opportunities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Sacramento, that we do hereby recognize Hawaiian Airlines and commemorate the inaugural flight between Sacramento, California and Hawaii by declaring Friday, June 7 as Hawaii Day, and furthermore ask that all Sacramento area residents celebrate this milestone in our region's travel industry history by wearing Hawaiian print attire on this day.
