SUBJECT: Retirement Hearing Commission Fire Safety Member Election

SUMMARY

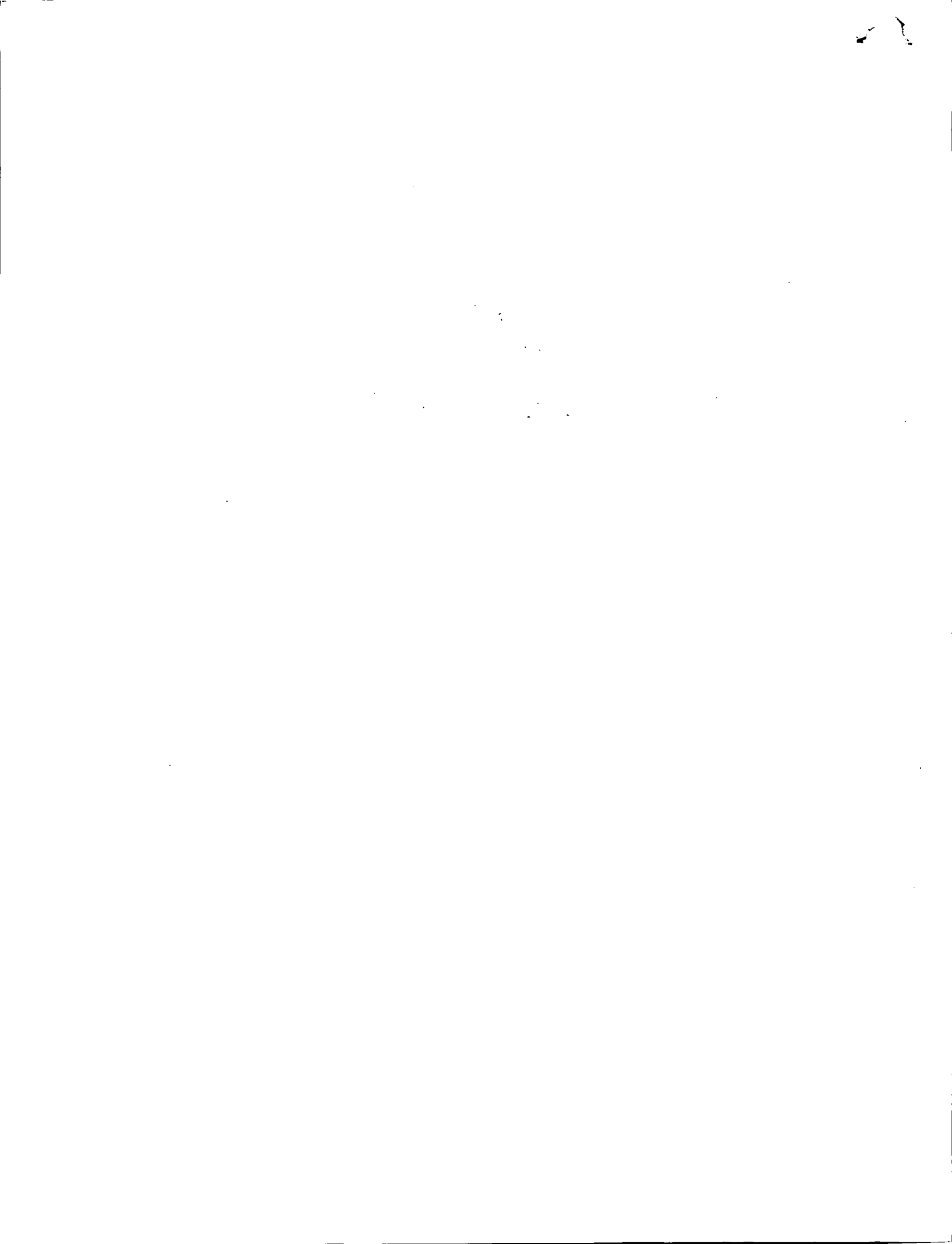
The four year term for Richard L. Mayberry, Fire Safety Member of the Sacramento City Retirement Hearing Commission will expire April 1, 1989. An election is being scheduled for March 21, 22, and 23, 1989 to fill the vacancy.

BACKGROUND

City Charter Sections 388 through 390 create the Retirement Hearing Commission, determine the membership and the selection of the members. Section 390(c) reads: "Each employee member shall be selected under procedures established by the City Council by and from persons in the active, non-retired members of the group which he shall represent."

On February 8, 1977, Resolution 77-061 was adopted to establish an election procedure for the selection of the three (3) Employee Members to the Retirement Hearing Commission. This resolution gave the City Clerk of the City of Sacramento the responsibility of conducting the elections to determine Employee Members of the Commission.

It is anticipated that a special municipal election will be held in June regarding a charter amendment to move Fire and Police Safety Members out of the Sacramento City Employees Retirement System (SCERS) into the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS). If this measure is approved by the voters, the Retirement Hearing Commission will be restructured to delete the Fire and Police safety member positions. However, an election to fill the fire safety member vacancy on the Retirement Hearing Commission must still be held in case the charter amendment is not ratified.

FINANCIAL DATA

Staff time expended away from the office while conducting precinct elections will result in a measurable disruption of normal work and may require overtime to compensate for this.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The procedures that will be followed to conduct the election are consistent with the Sacramento City Charter and Resolution 77-061.

MBE/WBE EFFORTS

There are no MBE/WBE considerations associated with this election.

RECOMMENDATION

Refer to the Office of the City Clerk the election of a Fire Safety Member for the Retirement Hearing Commission.
