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We have examined the statements of source and status of funds and program costs under the Community Development grant numbers B-75-MC-06-0003, B-76-MC-06-0003, B-77-MC-05-0003 and B-78-MC-06-0003 as of June 30, 1979, applicable to the program years ending June 30, 1976, June 30, 1977, June 30, 1978 and June 30, 1979, and for the respective program years in the period from July 1, 1975 through June 30, 1979. Our examination was made in accordance with the prescribed auditing standards and audit reguirements set forth in the Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Audit Guide and Standards for Community Development Block Grant Recipients and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting and records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

In our opinion, the statements referred to above present fairly the status of the Community Development funds and of the costs incurred under the Community Development program at June 30, 1979, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles and the requirements of HUD on a consistent basis. Further, costs incurred are eligible under the grant agreement and are in accordance with Federal Management Circular (FMC) 74-4.

We have also reviewed compliance and internal control matters in accordance with the provisions of the HUD Audit Guide for the Community Development Block Grant Program, and have included applicable comments.

COMMENTS ON COMPLIANCE AND INTERNAL CONTROL

We have examined the statements of source and status of funds and program costs applicable to the Community Development grants of the City of Sacramento for the period ended June 30, 1979 and have issued our report thereon dated September 21, 1979. As a part of our examination, we reviewed and tested the City's system internal accounting control to the extent we considered of necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted Under these standards, the purpose of such auditing standards. evaluation is to establish a basis for reliance thereon in determining the nature, timing, and extent of other auditing procedures that are necessary for expressing an opinion on the financial statements and to assist the auditor in planning and performing his examination of the financial statements. Additionally, our examination included procedures necessary in our judgment to determine compliance with regulations, policies, and procedures prescribed by HUD, insofar as such compliance review was necessary under the provisions set forth in Paragraph 31 of the HUD Audit Guide for Community Development Block Grant Recipients, dated May 1976.

The objective of internal accounting control is to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance as to the safeguarding of assets against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and the reliability of financial records for preparing financial statements and maintaining accountability for assets. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that the cost of a system of internal accounting control should not exceed the benefits derived, and also recognizes that the evaluation of these factors necessarily requires estimates and judgments by management.

There are inherent limitations that should be recognized in considering the potential effectiveness of any system of internal accounting control. In the performance of most control procedures, errors can result from misunderstanding of instructions, mistakes of judgment, carelessness, or other personal Control procedures whose effectiveness depends upon factors. of duties can be circumvented by segregation collusion. Similarly, control procedures can be circumvented intentionally by management with respect either to the execution and recording of transactions or

with respect to the estimates and judgments required in the preparation of financial statements. Further, projection of any evaluation of internal accounting control to future periods is subject to the risk that the procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions and that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

Based on our study and evaluation of the City's system of internal accounting control and our review of its compliance with various statutes and regulations, as prescribed in Paragraph 31 of the HUD Audit Guide for Community Development Block Grant Recipients, the City has complied with HUD's statutory and regulatory requirements except for those conditions described in the "Findings and Recommendations" section below.

Findings and Recommendations

Finding

The subgrantee bases its request for funds upon an estimate of future expenses, which is often inaccurate. Consequently, funds are not being disbursed within three days of receipt.

Criteria

Recipient's letters of credit should be for immediate cash requirements only (HUD Handbook 1900.23, Chapter 2a).

Effect

The subgrantee is not in compliance with HUD Handbook 1900.23, Chapter 2a, and could be required to finance CDBG operations with its own working capital (HUD Handbook 1900.23, Chapter 2f).

Recommendation

The subgrantee should develop a method to determine their immediate cash needs.

Finding

A review of the City of Sacramento contracts showed that appropriate provisions required by the Copeland Act, the federal examination of contractor's payroll records, and the 5% bid guarantee bond had not been incorporated into some of the contracts.

<u>Criteria</u>

Community Development Block Grant regulations require inclusion of wording to reflect the provisions under Section 570.610 and 6500.3 of the HUD Handbook.

Effect

Failure of the City to provide for adequate provisions places the City in violation of its grant agreement. It further places the City in the position of not being able to require compliance on the part of the contractor.

Cause

City contracting procedures under the Community Development Block Grant regulations were not fully understood by all City Personnel and an adequate system for review of contracts for compliance with CDBG regulations is in the process of being implemented.

Recommendation

A system for including these provisions of contracts under the Community Development Block Grant regulations should be instituted. A checklist could be developed specifically for Community Development Block Grant requirements. The checklist would be attached to each contract and signed by the reviewer to indicate compliance with the Block Grant regulations.
