SUBJECT: Camp Sacramento - Fee Increase

SUMMARY

This report provides the status of Camp Sacramento and reports on the 1987 season youth camp. In addition, this report recommends that Camp Sacramento fees be increased and returned to a resident/non-resident rate differential.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On June 16, 1987, staff recommended to the Budget and Finance Committee that Camp Sacramento be utilized for free mountain camping opportunities for deserving youth of Sacramento. In addition, the Budget and Finance Committee agreed to re-evaluate the status of the Camp Sacramento Fund during the FY 1987-88 mid-year budget review; and, accordingly, the Finance Department will submit a report at that time to recommend the appropriate funding source for Camp Sacramento.

1987 Season

In summer 1987, Camp Sacramento was able to offer a longer season than in 1986, making 130 more cabins available. Total attendance for the 1987 season was 2,779 (paid and unpaid), representing an 80% occupancy rate or 572 full cabins of 715 cabins offered. This represents a 29% increase in attendance over the previous season (572 cabins in 1987 versus 444 cabins in 1986). Revenue received during the 1987 season totalled \$205,976.

Over 130 camperships, utilizing vacant family cabins, were given to Sacramento area children. Agencies, such as Stanford Settlement and the Children's Receiving Home, serving low-income and underprivileged children in Sacramento, sponsored these three-day mountain vacations, providing supervision and transportation. The cost to the City of this youth camp program was approximately \$10,000 and was absorbed in the Camp Sacramento operating budget.

Fee Increase

~~Two changes in Camp Sacramento rates are recommended. First, staff feels that a return to the resident/non-resident rate differential is appropriate. Camp rates have been the same for both residents and non-residents since the 1984 season but with continued necessary General Fund support (\$98,000 subsidy in FY 1986-87, there is a basis for this rate differential. Second, it is recommended that Camp rates be increased by an average of 5% for weekly and mini-vacation sessions. Staff recommends an approximate 2.5% increase for city residents and approximately 7.5% for non-residents. (See Exhibit A.) It is expected that these fee increases will generate an additional \$10,000 in revenue during the 1988 season.~~

Friends of Camp Sacramento have reviewed these fee increases. Fee increases are to be effective January 1, 1988.

FINANCIAL DATA


The recommended rate differential and increases, to be effective January 15, 1988, are expected to generate an additional \$10,000 in revenue for Camp Sacramento. Revenue in FY 1987-88 is expected to total \$243,000.

The Finance Department will submit a separate report to the Budget and Finance Committee during the FY 1987-88 mid-year budget review to recommend the appropriate funding source for Camp Sacramento.


RECOMMENDATION
