The written portion of Uniform
Fireman Examination No. 342 was
conducted on this date at 7:30 A.M.

at the Sacramento Junior College.

After reviewing the outcome of the written portion of said examination, Mr. Deise moved that those candidates receiving a raw score of at least 91 be considered as receiving a passing grade of 70%; seconded by Mr. Marty and motion carried.

Identification envelopes were thereupon opened and successful candidates were tested for the Mile Run at the McClatchy High School Track at 10:30 A.M.

Upon the completion of the Mile Run, the Board reconvened at the Sacramento Turn Verein, 33rd & J Streets at 1:30 P.M. for the purpose of conducting the athletic event portion of said examination. Upon completion of the athletic events, Personal Interviews for those candidates who had successfully passed all portions of the examinations were conducted by members of the Board.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT

The members of the Board discussed
the enforcement of Rule XI, which
provides for the method of obtain-
ing permits to accept outside part-time employment.

Mr. Marty addressed the Board, stating that in his opinion the rule governing outside activities for City employees should be strictly enforced and if found to be violated, disciplinary action should be recommended to the City Manager.

Messrs. Wright and Deise also stated that if said rule cannot be enforced and if the outside activities of City employees cannot be properly controlled, said rule should be repealed and the matter referred to the City Council.

After general discussion by members of the Board, Mr. Wright thereupon moved that the Secretary be instructed to send a notice to all City employees

that applications must be filed with the Board not later than September 1, 1953, if the employee is accepting outside employment, and failure to do so will be cause for the Board to recommend to the City Manager that disciplinary action be taken against the employee; seconded by Mr. Marty and motion carried.

It was also the order of the Board that all departments be notified that it will be their responsibility to see that the employees of their department comply with the foregoing rule.
