Why is it a problem?







Low economic activity in local neighborhoods

District 8 council member Mai Vang and Former Mayor. Steinberg partnered to form the Food Justice Task Force. Which addresses food insecurity citywide.






Our Data Shows:

102 people were surveyed:

- 60% of people occasionally buy junk over healthy food
- 92% of people agree they would buy more produce. if there was a better variety of products
- 70% of people would choose to walk rather than drive if they had a supermarket in walking distance
- The majority of people agree their lives would improve with better access


