SUBJECT: Sacramento Local Conservation Corps' Request for Authorization of a
Grant Application to the State Division of Recycling

SUMMARY

This report requests authorization for the Sacramento Local Conservation Corps (SLCC) to submit a grant application to the California Department of Conservation's Division of Recycling. The purpose of the grant is to provide partial reimbursement for labor associated with the City's pilot curbside recycling program.

BACKGROUND

On January 12, 1988, the City Council authorized the City Manager to negotiate and execute a pilot curbside recycling program with the SLCC. Subsequent to execution of the aforementioned contract, SLCC learned that it could submit a proposal for a grant under the California Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Act (see attached Exhibit 1). However, the submission of the proposal requires approval of the local City Council.

FINANCIAL

The SLCC is requesting \$35,000 in grant funds for use in recycling programs within the City.

No City funds are requested.

The Sacramento Local Conservation Corps requests a Resolution from the City of Sacramento per the attached sample. The purpose of this resolution will be to provide the Sacramento Local Conservation Corps the necessary language as part of an RFP to the Department of Conservation, Division of Recycling. This language is required of us in order to proffer an acceptable RFP to obtain monies from California's new Bottle Bill.

The projects we will be proposing for partial reimbursement are the pilot curbside recycling program for the City of Sacramento (monies above and beyond the seed money you would be providing us), partial reimbursement of our labor for canvassing the recycling routes we will be operating (not included in your seed money) partial reimbursement for work to improve the operation of University Recycling at CSUS and partial reimbursement for our direct labor expense involved in operating our recycling center at Cosumnes River College.
