**RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING GEORGE W. BULLEN**

**IT IS HEREBY NOTED** that the people of this City suffered a great loss in the passing of George W. Bullen on the 27th day of October, 1987 at the age of 61 years in Sacramento, California; and

**WHEREAS**, George W. Bullen was a well-known and respected member of the Sacramento community whose exemplary efforts and accomplishments were of great value to the citizens and the City of Sacramento; and

**WHEREAS**, George W. Bullen was senior partner in the law firm of Bullen, McKone, McKinley, Gay, Keitges & Pach; and

**WHEREAS**, George W. Bullen's outstanding public service career included serving as the first president of the Jinan Sister City Association and led a Sacramento delegation to China in 1985 to sign the sister city accord; and

**WHEREAS**, George W. Bullen actively served on the Judicial Review Committee, which reviews prospective appointees for judicial appointments, and was a moving force behind the adoption of an ordinance banning smoking in public buildings; and

**WHEREAS**, George W. Bullen was an exceptional person who touched the lives of many and who will be deeply missed by all who came to know him; and

**WHEREAS**, this Council believes it proper that its minutes and the official records of the City recognize the passing of George W. Bullen and so, has caused this Resolution to be prepared;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED** that this Resolution be entered with the minutes of this meeting, in addition to which, this meeting shall be adjourned in respect for the memory of George W. Bullen.

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a suitable copy of this Resolution be tendered to George W. Bullen's wife, Dorothy, and his bereaved family, as an expression of this Council's deepest sympathy.
