



SUMMARY:

This is a request by the Sacramento Unified School District to utilize the Joaquin Miller School site for administrative offices and service programs. The staff and Planning Commission approved the Special Permit and the Commission's action was subsequently appealed to the City Council.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On August 21, 1981, the Planning Director approved a Special Permit to allow the Sacramento Unified School District to utilize Joaquin Miller for district administrative offices and other alternative education related programs. However, the Planning Director's action was appealed to the City Planning Commission. The Planning Commission considered the appeal of the Special Permit on September 24, 1981 and upheld the Planning Director's decision to grant the Special Permit. Subsequently, the Planning Commission's decision was appealed to the City Council.

The former use of the site was for a middle school program (grades 7-8) consisting of approximately 410 students and 44 staff members during the 1980-81 school year. This is a significant reduction of staff and students from prior years. As an example, during the 1960-61 school year, there were 1,660 students and 93 staff members.

In consideration of the request, both the staff and Planning Commission felt that the proposed use was similar to the former school use in

in terms of the amount of traffic generated to the site. The former use had as much as 93 employees, as compared to the proposed use with 91 employees. In addition, the former use had additional traffic that was generated by parents dropping off and picking up students.

Neighbors appeared at the Planning Commission meeting in opposition to the conversion of the school site into administrative offices and programs. They felt the secondary school should remain on the site.

A petition was also filed by many residents who supported the conversion of the school site. $\delta - \gamma$

VOTE OF PLANNING COMMISSION

On September 24, 1981, the Planning Commission, by a vote of three noes, five ayes, and one absent, failed to pass a motion to grant the appeal of the Planning Director's decision. As a result, the Planning Director's decision was upheld by the Planning Commission and the Special Permit was approved.

RECOMMENDATION

The staff and Planning Commission recommends that the appeal be denied and that the Special Permit be approved subject to findings of fact due on February 9, 1982.





STAFF EVALUATION: The applicant requests a Planning Director's Special Permit to modify the use of the three schools which have had regular K-12 education discontinued. The following summary identifies the former and intended uses for each site.

John F. Morse facility - 1901 - 60th Avenue

Former Use

Regular elementary school program for Grades K-6. During the 1980-81 school year, the 180 students at this school were being served by a staff of 25 employees. There were 36 off-street parking places available. During the 1972-73 school year, there were 410 students enrolled at the school and a total of 20 staff employees.

Proposed use 1981-82

The school district's Special Education Department administrative offices will be housed at this facility. This will include a total of 35 permanent employees; however, because of staff meetings, as many as 100 employees may be there at any given time. Meetings of this type could, of course, occur at any school regardless of the status of its program. Sixty-two additional off-street parking places can be made available without impacting the recreational offerings. Overflow parking onto residential streets probably will be less than what might have occurred had the school remained in operation with staff meetings scheduled, on occasion, as generally happens. All other recreational facilities, and the Multipurpose Room, will remain available for use by the community. A lower population concentration at this location should more nearly comply with the goals set forth in the proposed Airport Land Use Plan. will no longer be necessary to schedule a bus into the school six times daily, as was the case during the 1980-81 school.year. Other surplus space in the building would be offered for rent to local governmental agencies, and the extent of that rental program is unknown at this time. Proposed uses would be reviewed for zoning consistency.

Joaquin Miller Facility - 4701 Joaquin Way

Former Use

Regular middle school program for Grades 7-8. During the 1980-81 school year, the 410 students at this school were being served by a staff of 44 employees. There were 67 off-street parking places available. During the 1960-61 school year, there were 1660 students enfolled at Miller and a total of 93 staff employees.

Proposed Use 1981-82

Several of the districts' administrative offices and service programs currently located at the Lincoln facility (407 Q Street) will be moved to Joaquin Miller. These include:

- a. Pupil Personnel Service these services must be housed in a conforming (earthquake safe) structure because students from throughout the district find it necessary to go to these offices for various reasons such as: work permits, discipline hearings, etc. The offices include the Health Services Section; the Psychological and Social Work Services Section, including the school psychologists and social workers who spend most of their time in the field; the Child Welfare and Attendance Services Section; Hearing Officer Section, Foster Youth Services Program Section; Elementary Counseling Services Section, including the counselors who spend most of their time in the field.
- b. Staff Training Services although the office staff is relatively small, this service requires a great deal of space for demonstrating programs to teaching staff and others located throughout the district and space for displaying instructional materials.
- c. The Third District PTA Office.
- d. The Sacramento Council PTA Office.
- e. Central Library Services this includes the district's professional library which is an extension of the libraries located at individual school sites and also contains materials for district staff. Also included is a multicultural library, a library for EDY (Educationally Disadvantaged Youth) and a music library.
- f. Hollywood Park Elementary School one room will continue to be used for the adjacent Hollywood Park Elementary School music program.
- g. Audiovisual Services these services will continue to be housed in four portable classrooms to be moved from Lincoln to the Joaquin Miller site.

Other alternative education related programs are as follows:

- 1. Title IX Compliance office
- 2. The Gifted and Talented Program office
- 3. The Educational Disadvantaged Youth Materials Center
- 4. Multicultural Library
- 5. Music Library
- 6. Outdoor Programs office
- 7. Professional Library
- 8. Pupil Services Department
- 9. Indian Education Program
- 10. Outreach/Partnership Program
- 11. Sacramento Council of the PTA
- 12. Staff Training
- 13. 3rd District PTA office
- 14. Instructional Materials Library

The district will continue to make available to the community existing recreational facilities, including the gymnasium. The Miller auditorium will be used by the district staff. Meeting facilities for the community will be made available by using the gymnasium, as is the case in most of the district's schools.

Ninety-five staff members will be permanently housed at this site to provide the necessary services. On occasion, the number of individuals at the site will be increased because of meetings, etc. Additional off-street parking will be provided to accommodate a total of 107 vehicles. Overflow parking onto residential streets should be no greater than would be the case at any of the district's schools under normal conditions.

The reduced population concentration at this location will more nearly comply with the goals set forth in the Airport Land Use Plan.

Peter Lassen Facility - 5022 - 58th Street

Former Use

Regular middle school program for Grades 7-9. During the 1980-81 school year, the 560 students at this school were being served by a staff of 52 employees. There were 122 off-street parking places available. During the 1960-61 school year, there were 1780 students enrolled at the school and a total of 95 staff employees.

Proposed Use 1981-82

The district intends to relocate the Multilingual and Categorical Program offices currently housed at Lincoln and the Vocational Education Offices currently housed at Luther Burbank Senior High School at Peter Lassen. The major use, however, will be for two district instructional programs:

- a. Newcomer Center approximately 250 students from all parts of the district, generally new arrivals with limited-or non-English speaking ability, such as the Indo-Chinese students that have been entering our district in large numbers in recent months. This center will provide all newcomer limited-English speaking students with bilingual instruction, so that they may acquire basic English skills (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) and social adjustment to their new country as quickly as possible. There will be two components: the screening and orientation component and the newcomer school (Grades K-8). This is a transitional program that more than likely will last for one year only.
- b. The Regional Occupational Program (ROP). This program will serve from 175 to 265 high school age students. An automobile painting facility (approximately the size of a single car garage) will be constructed at the site as part of this program. This new structure will be located well away from the surrounding residential dwellings.

Most of the students in these two programs will be transported to the school by six buses making a maximum of five trips daily. As many as 140 additional parking places can be made available on the paved play area for a total of 262 spaces for the 90 permanent staff members and 30 student automobiles.

Recreational and community meeting facilities will continue to be made available to the general public.

The applicant has indicated that only minor interior modifications are to be made in these buildings to accommodate the administration offices and programs listed. Modifications would consist of some interior room partition and door opening revisions, storage and shelving, handicapped facilities, communications, additional floor covering revisions, and electrical revisions to provide additional outlets for office machines.

Generally, the population (employees and students) at each site will be less than it has been with the regular school program, particularly when compared with the peak loads accommodated in previous years. In those cases where an increase in the number of cars is expected, the district will provide additional off-street parking. There will be occasions when overflow parking onto residential streets will occur, but that can and does happen even now in the regular programs at all of the district's schools.

The district will continue to maintain existing recreational and community meeting facilities for local residents.

At the John F. Morse facility there is no conflict with the Airport Land Use Committee's (ALUC) proposed plan; office uses are consistent with the proposed Community Land Use Plan (CLUP) whereas schools are not. Therefore, the proposal constitutes an improvement over existing conditions.

The proposed office use of the Joaquin Miller Facility is less intensive than the former use. The proposed office use conforms with ALUC's proposed CLUP. The expansion of use does not conflict with the proposed ALUC-CLUP, provided that the portable classrooms are not used for classroom purposes. The auditorium is an existing inconsistent use under the CLUP and may continue to be used.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: A Negative Declaration was filed with the County Clerk, by the School District, on July 21, 1981.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Special Permit request be approved, with conditions, based on the applicant's proposed use. Any modification of that use shall be subject to the Planning Director's review and approval. The recommendation is based on the following conditions and findings of fact.

Conditions

- 1. The District shall provide the Planning Director assurance and plans of adequate off-street parking facilities for those occassional large meetings, for students who drive, as well as staff. If occassional parking becomes permanent parking, it shall be improved to City parking standard, including parking shading.
- 2. Portable structures being moved to Joaquin Miller facility shall not be used as classrooms.

- 1. The projects are based on sound principles of land use in that:
