ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_, FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING A CODE OF FAIR COMPETITION FOR THE CLEANING AND DYEING INDUSTRY IN SACRAMENTO CITY AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1. A Code of Fair Competition for the Cleaning and Dyeing Industry in Sacramento City is hereby provided and set up in the words and figures following, to-wit:

"CODE OF FAIR COMPETITION"

FOR THE CLEANING AND DYEING INDUSTRY IN SACRAMENTO CITY

ARTICLE I - OBJECTS AND PURPOSES

(a) This Code is set up, under and by virtue of Chapter 814 of Statutes of California, 1935, which is hereby referred to and made a part hereof, for the purpose of increasing employment, establishing fair and adequate wages, effecting necessary reduction of hours, improving the standards of labor, and to eliminate unfair trade practices and ruinous price-cutting evils to the end of rehabilitating the Cleaning and Dyeing Industry in Sacramento and enable it to do its part toward establishing that balance of industries which is necessary to the restoration and maintenance of the highest practical degree of public welfare.

(b) It is the declared purpose of the Cleaning and Dyeing Industry in Sacramento to bring, insofar as may be practical, the rates of wages paid within the Cleaning and Dyeing Industry to such levels as are necessary for the creation and maintenance of the highest practical standard of living, to restore the income of enterprises within the industry to levels which will make possible the payment of such wages, and to avoid a further depletion and destruction through impending bankruptcy of the greater part of this industry; and from time to time to revise the rates of wages in such manner as will currently reflect the equitable adjustment to variations in the cost of living.

(c) It shall be the purpose of the industry in adherence to this Code to improve the general sanitary and health conditions of the Cleaning and Dyeing Industry, protect the public from fraudulent schemes in connection therewith; to disseminate information concerning modern cleaning methods and practices toward the end that the public may the better appreciate the care, considera-

tion and attention now being given to the cleaning product, and to instill a spirit of cooperation among its members for the accomplishment of these objects and purposes.

(d) To disseminate knowledge among its members as to the use of scientific management, system and cost accounting, sound credit and collection methods, and to promote and assist in putting into effect the use thereof.

(e) To provide a Control Committee, empowered to enforce the provisions of this Code as hereafter provided.

(f) To provide an impartial Board of Adjustment through which any claims for damages to customers' goods may be considered.

(g) It is the purpose of this industry to abide by the provisions of Chapter 814 of Statutes of California, 1935. This Act is commonly known as the Service Trades Act.

#### ARTICLE II - TERRITORY

(a) The territory embraced within the confines of this industry is the Sacramento City Limits.

#### ARTICLE III - PARTICIPATION AND VOTING

(a) Participation in this Code and any subsequent revision of or addition to the Code shall be extended to any person, partnership or corporation engaged in the Cleaning and Dyeing Industry in the Sacramento City Limits.

(b) Participation in this Code is not only extended to all units of the industry operating cleaning and/or dyeing plants, but also to press shop operators, tailors and commission drivers (commonly known as outside drivers or route men, i.e. those who own and maintain their delivery equipment).

(c) No initiation or entrance fees shall be charged, but there shall be dues levied on the following basis:

#### DUES

Monthly Volume of Business up to \$400.00 per month      \$2.00 per mo.  
50¢ per Month Additional for each \$100.00 volume over \$400.00 per mo.

Subscription fees or other assessments, if any, shall be levied on the same basis, provided not less than 66-2/3% of the membership approves of the amount of such assessments. All dues, subscription fees or other assessments shall be based on the average monthly volume of business handled during the immediate preceding six-month period.

(d) Dues are payable three (3) months in advance and are due August 15th, November 15th, February 15th and May 15th of each year.

(e) Each member in good standing in the Industry is to have one vote.

#### ARTICLE IV - ADMINISTRATION

(a) A Committee of five members shall be appointed by the president of this industry to represent the membership in any conference respecting this Code of Fair Competition before the City Commission of Sacramento. The president shall be an ex officio member of this committee. This committee shall be known hereafter as the Executive Control Committee.

(b) The Executive Control Committee shall be charged with the enforcement of the provisions of this Code and with the duties, through agents or otherwise, of hearing or adjusting complaints, considering proposals for amendments and making recommendations thereon, approving recommendations and exceptions to the provisions of this Code and otherwise administering its provisions.

(c) The Executive Control Committee is charged with the arbitration of all controversies between members of this industry and/or any controversies between members and the industry at large. If any member of this committee is a party to a controversy existing between two or more members, the president shall temporarily appoint another member or members to the board to consider such controversy, or the president may himself serve in such capacity.

(d) The Executive Control Committee shall have full authority to investigate all controversies and may levy a fine against the offending member or members, and may make its order that the offending member pay to the industry said fine, which shall not be in excess of fifteen times the weekly value of the business

lost by the complaining competitor or competitors. In the event that the offending member or members continue to violate this code after said order has been made, and they have received notice thereof, a separate fine may be levied against such member or members for each day's violation for any of the provisions of this code, but such fine is not to exceed \$100.00 for each such daily violation.

(e) All controversies shall be reported in writing in duplicate, one copy to be filed with the Chairman of the Executive Control Committee, and one copy to be filed with the Secretary of this Industry.

(f) Members shall be charged with the responsibility to see that the provisions of this Code are lived up to by any press shops, agencies or outside route men that they are serving, and shall refuse to further serve any such press shop, agency or route man who continues to violate any provision of this Code.

#### ARTICLE V - PRODUCTION PROVISIONS

(a) No limitation shall be placed upon any member which might restrain said member from installing new machinery and equipment, opening new offices, or entering any phase of this industry.

#### ARTICLE VI - COST, SALES PRICES AND DISCOUNT PROVISIONS

(a) It shall be an unfair method of competition for any person engaged in the Cleaning and Dyeing Industry to sell below the minimum price set forth in the Schedule "A" attached hereto.

(b) On and after the effective date of this Code, the minimum net cost to the customer for all cleaning, pressing and/or dyeing services shall be not less than that set forth in the attached Schedule "A"---Minimum Prices for Cleaning, Pressing and Dyeing Services---and all quotations and charges shall be made only on that basis. All advertising matter, whether by newspaper, radio, bill

(d) Enticing away any employee of a competitor with the purpose and effect of unduly hampering, injuring or embarrassing said competitor in his business.

(e) Any attempt to induce the breach of existing contracts or orders between competitors and their customers by any means whatsoever, or interfering with or obstructing the performance of any such contractual duties or services by any such means, with the purpose and effect of unduly hampering, injuring or embarrassing competitors in their business.

(f) The defamation of competitors by falsely imputing to them dishonorable conduct, inability to perform contracts, questionable credit standing or by other false statements or imputations, or by the false disparagement of the grade or quality of their products or service, with the purpose of misleading or deceiving a customer or by injuriously affecting the business of such competitors.

(g) Enticing away an outside or commission driver of a competitor with the purpose and/or effect of unduly hampering, injuring or causing financial loss to said competitor.

(h) To secure, attempt to secure, or use either directly or indirectly any list or lists of any other member's customers.

(i) Hiring, employing or using any driver, route man, solicitor, or agent who has been hired or employed by another member, unless such driver, route man, or solicitor shall present a letter of clearance from said member or a period of ninety days shall have elapsed. This shall include the so-called independent driver who owns his own route.

(j) Performing any service for any press shop, agency, or outside route man in violation of any contractual relations existing between said press shop, agency, or outside route man and a member.

(k) To use or permit to be used (unless approved by the former employer in writing) as solicitor or route man any employee or person who has been a

board, circular, dodger or any other means, shall use and quote prices not less than those given in the attached Schedule "A"; and net prices arrived at after allowing any discount (where allowable) shall not be used, quoted or printed in any manner whatsoever except cash and carry discounts where the words "Cash and Carry" are used.

(c) No sales discounts, commissions, premiums, free work, secret rebates, or any other special inducements of any kind shall be made except the following:

(1) Hotels and apartments may be given a 10% discount upon the gross amount of cleaning and dyeing work which they pay for, providing the work is picked up from one central place and delivered to the same place. An agency sign must be prominently displayed and the agency must be responsible to the Industry member for the collection and full payment of such services.

(2) Outside or commission drivers who own and maintain their delivery equipment may be given a maximum commission of 35% of the volume of work handled. These outside or commission drivers may be given this maximum commission only provided they are responsible for all customers' accounts, and all billings are to be direct to the driver instead of to individual customers.

#### ARTICLE VII - PROVISIONS RESPECTING UNFAIR PRACTICES

The following are agreed to as unfair trade practices:

(a) The giving of any sales discounts, commissions, free work, secret rebates, cash checks, trading stamps, premiums, or any other special inducement of any kind to any customer, prospective customer, or employee of such customer or prospective customer provided, however;

(b) In the event a customer should deliver his articles to an agency, a press shop, a branch office, or to the office of a plant, call for the same and pay cash therefor, a maximum discount of 10% from all prices enumerated in Schedule "A" may be made to the customer.

(c) The giving of any week-end discount.

solicitor or route man for another member in the same territory in which such solicitor or route man was employed by the other member until a period of one year shall have elapsed.

(l) To do or perform any work or service for any press shop, agency, or outside route man until such press shop, agency, or outside route man shall have paid for all service previously rendered by another member of this Industry.

(m) The granting of credit terms in excess of forty-five days' business to any press shop, agency or outside route man.

(n) To use, participate in, publish, or broadcast any untrue, deceptive or misleading statement, representation or illustration; or to make unfair competitive claims such as to advertise a member's dry cleaning or dyeing work as the best or the finest in an effort to sell such services.

(o) To pay a percentage or commission or to make a gift to any organization not identified with the industry for its soliciting of cleaning or dyeing services.

(p) To give any lump estimates or bids to department stores, homes, hotels, clubs, theaters or others for quantities of work.

#### ARTICLE VIII - STATISTICS

In order to provide data necessary for the submittance of this Code of Fair Competition and for its administration under the said above-mentioned Service Trades Act, the members of this Industry agree to furnish all possible statistics and information as required, either by the Executive Control Committee, the City of Sacramento's duly constituted representatives and/or any agent appointed by the Executive Control Committee.

#### ARTICLE IX - GENERAL

(a) No provision in this Code shall be interpreted or applied in such manner as to

(1) Promote monopolies

- (2) Permit or encourage unfair competition
- (3) Eliminate or oppress small enterprises
- (4) Discriminate against small enterprises

(b) This Code or any of its provisions may be canceled or modified to the extent necessary to conform to any action by the City Council of Sacramento or by action of the duly constituted representatives of the City Manager or City Council of Sacramento.

(c) Any word, term or phrase used in this Code is defined to have the meaning prescribed to it in Webster's International Dictionary, unless defined herein under Schedule "B"; in such case the definitions in Schedule "B" shall prevail.

(d) If any provision of this Code is declared invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall nevertheless continue in full force and effect the same as if they had been separately presented for approval and approved.

(e) Amendments to this Code may be adopted by an 80% vote of the membership and shall be effective when approved by ordinance of the City Council of Sacramento.

(f) Violation by any member of any provision of this Code or any approved rule issued thereunder or of agreed minimum prices is a violation of the Code and is a misdemeanor and punishable as provided in Section 6 of the said Service Trades Act of 1935, known as Chapter 814 of the Statutes of California, 1935.

SCHEDULE "B"  
DEFINITIONS

SACRAMENTO CLEANING AND DYEING INDUSTRY

I Cleaning and Dyeing Industry defined includes all persons, partnerships or corporations engaged in the cleaning, pressing and/or dyeing of garments and/or household articles for two or more customers, as follows:

- (a) Cleaning - commonly known as Dry Cleaning - is defined as the immersion in volatile, moisture-free solvents of petroleum distillate type, coal tar distillate type, or chlorated, hydrocarbon type, of any garment or household article.
- (b) Pressing - as herein used, is defined as pressing and/or re-shaping any fabric, either by hand or by machine, through the use of steam, heat, air, or other means, after such fabric has been dry-cleaned, or pressing and/or re-shaping any fabric, which even though not dry-cleaned, could not be washed with water.
- (c) Dyeing - is defined as the coloring, staining or tinting of any garment and/or household article.

II Press Shops - are defined as being any shop or agency which finishes by pressing and/or re-shaping any fabric, either by hand or by machine, that has been dry cleaned.

III Agencies - are defined as any retailer, branch store, tailor, barber shop, hotel, apartment house, or club which receives cleaning, pressing and/or dyeing work for customers.

IV Routemen - are defined as any person, partnership or corporation engaged in the picking up and delivery of cleaning, pressing and/or dyeing work.

- (a) Inside Routemen are routemen employed by Cleaners and/or Dyers and/or Press Shop Operators where the employer owns the good will (list of customers) and pays the employee a guaranteed minimum wage, with or without an additional commission upon cash collections.
- (b) Outside Routemen are defined as routemen who own their own good will (list of customers) and contract with a Cleaner and/or Dyer and/or Press Shop Operator for the cleaning, pressing and/or dyeing of garments and/or household articles.

V Monthly Volume of Business - is defined to mean the average total monthly volume of cleaning, pressing and dyeing business handled during any six-month period immediately preceding the date upon which dues are payable.

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision or provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period not exceeding 6 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Each and every days' continuance of such violation shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 3. This ordinance is enacted under and by virtue of Chapter 814 of the Statutes of 1935 of the State of California, and all applicable provisions of said Act are incorporated herein.
