Gentlemen:

Pursuant to its duties under contract 11, the Coast Construction Company invited new proposals under the Contract provisions for centrifugal pumps and appurtenances for the new pumping station. On March 3 the propositions covering two makes of pumps were submitted to the Resident Engineer. These propositions included prices, guaranteed efficiencies and statements respecting the degree to which the contract provisions could be fulfilled. They were duly and thoroughly considered by the Contract Committee on the basis of the completeness of fulfillment of all contract provisions and in the light of a great mass of fundamental information and experience at the disposal of and representing the training of the members of the Committee.

On March 5, the Contract Committee addressed a communication to the Coast Construction Company, signed by the Resident Engineer for the Committee, advising the Company of its decision in the matter, namely that De Laval pumps represent the best available pumping equipment whose use would result in the greatest ultimate economy and satisfaction to the City.

This decision was presented by the Coast Construction Company to the City of Sacramento on the grounds that it would represent an added investment cost of some \$8000.00 in the plant over and above the cost which would be necessary if Byron - Jackson pumps were purchased. An informal hearing between the City Commission, representatives of the Coast Construction Company and the Engineers of the Contract Committee was had on March 18th, and on the following day, pursuant to the expressed wish of the City Commission, a hearing of the representatives of several pump manufacturers was held by the Contract Committee.

On March 21, Latourrette-Fical Company addressed a letter to the City Commission objecting to the stated conclusions of the Contract Committee in favor of DeLaval pumps. The Company asked for another hearing on March 25th, which privilege was granted. On this date, March 26th, a conference was held between the members of the City Commission and the Engineers of the Contract Committee. At the conclusion of this conference the Contract Committee reaffirmed its previous decision and advised the City Commission that its recent hearings and investigations had served only to strengthen its conclusions previously stated, namely, that the purchase and installation of De Laval pumps will, in its opinion, result in the greatest ultimate economy and satisfaction to the City.

Of the two propositions placed before the Contract Committee, that covering DeLaval pumps is the only one which completely fulfills all contract provisions and requirements. The City is not warranted in waiving the Contract provisions. Holding all facts and conditions in review, it is the unanimous opinion of the Contract Committee that the advantages which will accrue from the use of the pumps recommended will far outweigh the additional cost involved. We therefore repeat our earnest recommendation that a purchase order for this equipment be immediately issued by the Coast Construction Company.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 1524.

RESOLVED, That it is the intention of the City Commission of the City of Sacramento to or-
der the following Street Work to be done, to-wit:

Improving 17th Street, in the City of Sacramento, by constructing concrete curbs and gut-
ters on official line and grade on the east side of said street from the southerly line of E Street
to the northerly line of F Street, and

Improving 18th Street, in the City of Sacramento, by constructing concrete curb and gutter
on official line and grade on the west side of 18th Street, from the southerly line of E Street to
the northerly line of F Street.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications heretofore adop-
ted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the Superintendent of Streets.

And notice is hereby given that all persons objecting to said work are required to file
their objections in writing, in the office of the City Clerk, of the City of Sacramento, as re-
quired by law, stating how much frontage on said streets is represented by the party so objecting,
and on what street the property so represented is located.

And the City Clerk is hereby directed to post this Resolution conspicuously for two days
near the door of the Council Chamber of the City Commission; also to publish the same for two days
in the Sacramento Union a daily newspaper, as required by law.

The Sacramento Union a daily newspaper, is hereby designated as the paper in which to pub-
lish the Notices required by law to be published by the Superintendent of Streets of said city, in
relation to the work described aforesaid.

With reference to the form of ballot to be used at the forthcoming general municipal elec-
tion, advise you that the form is controlled by Section 273 of the Freeholders' Charter, which is
now in effect for purposes of such election. You will have the full names of all regular nominated

Law Clerk of the City Attorney (Prosecuting Attorney of the Police Court) \$300.00 was omitted in the
Budget of 1921, Now therefor be it

RESOLVED, that the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) dollars be and the same is hereby appro-
priated for the purpose of paying for stenographical work in the office of the said Law Clerk of
the City Attorney and that the City Auditor be and he is hereby directed to transfer said sum
(\$300.00) from the Emergency Fund and place the same in the General Office Fund (City Attorney al-
lowance) to be used for said purpose.

in price on purchase of office furniture utilized in Recreation Center No. 1, as the United States Government was not a party to the ownership of said furniture and following Resolution was thereupon finally considered:

It appearing that Recreation Center No. One is using certain furniture and accessories belonging to the National Community Service, appraised at the value of \$847.00, and which can be purchased for the sum of \$412.00, and that said property is necessary for carrying on the work of the said Recreation Center, and that unless purchased by the City said property is liable to be taken away by the owner thereof and disposed to other persons:

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Board of Playground Directors be, and it hereby is, authorized to purchase the aforesaid property for the use of said Recreation Center No. One, for the said sum of \$412.00, the same to be paid out of Recreation Center No. One Fund.

Commissioner Brown moved that Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes and carried by following vote:

WHEREAS: The Flood Control plan for the SACRAMENTO RIVER has been formally approved and adopted by the CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES and provisions made for ways and means to carry on this project as provided in "Act to provide for the control of the floods of the Mississippi River and of the Sacramento River, California, and for other purposes" and recorded in Chapter 144, page 948 of United States Statutes at Large, 64th Congress, 1915-1917, Vol. 31, part 1, Public Laws, approved March 1st, 1917, and,

WHEREAS: This law provides for the construction of the Sacramento Weir and By-pass, and for the manner by which the distribution of the costs are to be borne jointly by the State and the Federal Government, the State to pay for all rights of way and the Government for all weirs, and,

WHEREAS: The City of Sacramento has built, in accordance with plans approved by the War Department, and under a permit issued by said War Department, and under the supervision of its Engineers, that portion of the flood control plan known as the SACRAMENTO WEIR, and being that portion of the project which is to be paid for by the Federal Government in pursuance of the Act above recited, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED: That the City of Sacramento submit to the Federal Government, through its representative in Congress, a claim for the amount to spend in such construction, with accrued interest to date and interest accruing from date to date of final payment by said Federal Government and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City instruct its representative to use every effort to obtain early and favorable action on such claim, and to advise him that if he deems it necessary and advisable the City will send its City Engineer, under whose personal direction the entire work was done, or its City Attorney, or both, to Washington to testify before the proper committee at the proper time, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That copies of this Resolution be attached to said claim and furnished to said representative in Congress.

Commissioner Carmichael moved that Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

Commissioner Carmichael presented copy of letter to be forwarded to Honorable Charles F. Curry, Congressman from Third District, State of California, as follows:

Hon. Charles F. Curry,
Washington, D. C.,
Dear Sir:

Enclosed please find in quadruplicate a CLAIM by the CITY of SACRAMENTO against the FEDERAL GOVERNMENT for the cost of constructing the SACRAMENTO WEIR, all of which is as you know, a part of the general flood control plan for the Sacramento River as worked out by the California Debris Commission, and finally approved by Congress, and provision for ways and means established in "An Act to provide for the control of the floods of the Mississippi River and of the Sacramento River, California, and for other purposes, and recorded in Chapter 144, page 948 of United States Statutes at Large, 64th Congress 1915 - 1917, Vol. 31, part 1, Public Laws. Approved March 1st, 1917.

As you are aware the City of Sacramento, in view of the extensive reclamation work along the Sacramento river, (See page 160 of your "supplemental Report on FLOOD CONTROL OF THE SACRAMENTO RIVER" to accompany H. R. 14777) did not deem it wise to postpone the construction of the Sacramento Weir until such time as the United States Government could provide the funds, and accordingly undertook the construction of this unit of the project with funds provided by the City. For this work including the cost of the rights of way for the by-pass and levies, the City provided \$647,943.28. Of this amount, however, the State of California, through its RECLAMATION BOARD, has been billed with \$486,236.16, leaving a balance \$161,707.12, and interest to date, amounting to \$43,523.50, which should be paid by the Federal Government.

It is interesting to note that the original estimate for this Weir, as shown in the report referred to above was for a length of weir 1680 feet at an estimated cost of \$168,000.00 (Page 102 #91) while the over-all length of the structure as built is 2080 feet, and the crest of the weir proper 1832 feet, and the cost to the Federal Government \$161,707.12 plus interest \$43,523.50 equals \$205,230.62.

This work was done under the supervision of the U. S. Engineer officer located in this district, in accordance with plans approved by the Chief of Engineers, under permit issued by the Secretary of War.

The State Reclamation Board levied Sacramento by-pass assessment #3 to cover the cost of this weir and to repay the City for rights of way purchased for the Bypass. The total assessment (See same report as above, page 162) was \$1,095,000.00 of which \$800,471.90 was assessed against

property lying within the City of Sacramento, and was paid as provided by law. One half of this, or \$400,235.95, returned by the State was applied to every individual assessment, so that each individual received a receipt in full for the assessment against his property, by paying the other half himself. 223

It is this apparent that the City has already paid \$800,471.90 toward the construction of this unit of the flood control project, and should not be obliged to pay this additional amount, as expressed in this claim.

The records show that this work was undertaken by the City with the full intent of billing this cost against the Federal Government. The files of Lieut. Col. L. H. Rand, who was U. S. Engineer Officer in charge of this District during the entire time of the construction will bear out this statement, and Col. Rand will be able to certify to the character of the work.

We are submitting this claim direct to you in the hope that you may be able to secure early and favorable action upon it. The City stands ready to defend it to any extent you may deem it necessary, even to sending its City Engineer, under whose personal supervision the entire work is done, or its City Attorney, or both, to Washington to testify before the proper committee at the proper time.

You are so thoroughly familiar with this entire matter that you will probably need but little other information, but if you require any further detail, please advise and it will be furnished as promptly as possible.
