Description/Analysis

Issue: Title 14 California Code of Regulations, Division 7, Chapter 5, Section 18050, requires each local jurisdiction to designate a Local Enforcement Agency to enforce solid waste standards and administer solid waste facility permits. The LEA is responsible for the inspection and enforcement of solid waste regulations pertaining to solid waste facilities. In the City of Sacramento this includes the City of Sacramento 28th Street Landfill, the Sacramento Recycling and Transfer Station, small abandoned landfills and other solid waste facilities operated within the City of Sacramento.

Resolution 92-094 (Exhibit 1) designated the Sacramento County Health Division as the LEA for the City of Sacramento. Recently, the Sacramento County Environmental Management Department moved the LEA from the Health Division to the Hazardous Materials Division in the Sacramento County Department of Environmental Management. Sacramento County Department of Environmental Management has requested that the City of Sacramento formally recognize this Department as their LEA.


Policy Considerations: Approval of this resolution will support the City Council goal of sustainable neighborhoods.

Environmental Considerations: This request is not subject to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under the general rule (Section 1506(b)(c)) that CEQA applies only to projects that have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.

Rationale for Recommendation: The attached resolution is at the request of the Sacramento County Department of Environmental Management in order to officially designate the Sacramento Environmental Management Department as the LEA for the City of Sacramento.

Financial Considerations: The proposed action will have no financial impact to the City.

18050. Scope.

This Article sets forth the requirements for the designation of a local agency as an enforcement agency, and the establishment of hearing panels pursuant to the California Integrated Solid Waste Management Act of 1989. A local governing body of a city, county, or a joint powers body may designate a single local agency to be its enforcement agency pursuant to Section 18051 of this Article. Upon board approval of the designation and certification(s) of the local agency pursuant to Articles 2.0, 2.1, and 2.2 of this Chapter, the designated local agency shall become the local enforcement agency (LEA) in the designated jurisdiction. A local governing body may enter into a contract or joint powers agreement with another LEA for permitting, inspection, and enforcement duties within its territorial jurisdiction. This action is to board approval of the designation and certification of the contract LEA or the joint powers LEA.

Each local governing body that wishes to designate a local agency shall so notify the board. The notice of designation, by the local governing body of a local agency, shall be part of a designation information package (DIP) which includes the following information:

DESIGNATING THE SACRAMENTO COUNTY ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT AS THE LOCAL ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FOR ENFORCEMENT OF SOLID WASTE STANDARDS AND ADMINISTRATION OF SOLID WASTE FACILITY PERMITS

BACKGROUND

- A. Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, Sections 18050 and 18051 require local jurisdictions to designate a Local Enforcement Agency for the enforcement of solid waste standards and administration of solid waste facility permits.
- B. Resolution 92-094 designates the County of Sacramento Environmental Health Division as the Local Enforcement Agency.
- C. Recently the Local Enforcement Agency was moved from the County of Sacramento Environmental Health Division to the County of Sacramento Environmental Management Department, Hazardous Materials Division.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Designates the County of Sacramento Environmental Management Department as the Local Enforcement Agency for the City of Sacramento.

A RESOLUTION REDESIGNATING THE SACRAMENTO COUNTY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DIVISION AS THE SINGLE LOCAL ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FOR SACRAMENTO CITY SOLID WASTE ACTIVITIES

WHEREAS, California Administrative Code, Title 14 Sections 18051 and 18052 require that existing Local Enforcement Agencies be redesignated by jurisdictions based on their population; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento has a population of 369,365; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento has designated the Sacramento County Environmental Health Division as the Local Enforcement Agency for Sacramento City Solid Waste since January 22, 1985; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento desires to redesignate the Sacramento County Environmental Health Division as its Local Enforcement Agency;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO that the Sacramento County Environmental Health Division is redesignated as the local enforcement agency for all Sacramento City Solid Waste activities.
