SUMMARY

The Police Department received \$150,000 in Capital Improvement Project funds, in FY 85-86, for purchasing California Identification System Remote Access Network (Cal-ID RAN) equipment, materials, and supplies. As a condition of providing Cal-ID RAN equipment, the State of California requires a resolution be adopted by the City Council authorizing the State to make the equipment purchase on behalf of the City.

Phase I expenditures for Cal-ID RAN equipment, materials and supplies will be approximately \$63,200. The remaining funds (\$86,000) will be utilized in subsequent phases of program implementation. No additional funds are requested.

Adoption of the resolution authorizing the State of California to purchase Cal-ID RAN equipment on behalf of the City of Sacramento is recommended.

BACKGROUND

The Police Department requested and received Capital Improvement Project funds, in FY 85-86, to purchase equipment, materials and supplies for the California Identification System Remote Access Network (Cal-ID RAN).

The State of California will provide 70% of the training and equipment cost for the Cal-ID RAN program. The remaining program costs will be jointly supported by the Sacramento Police Department and Sacramento County Sheriff's Department. A User's Agreement, not requiring City Council action, has been drafted delineating the responsibilities for each agency.

The Cal-ID RAN system is a computerized identification system made available to local law enforcement agencies via a statewide Remote Access Network (RAN). The purchase of the RAN equipment will provide the Sacramento Police Department with state of the art technology to directly

access Cal-ID data bases. Our in-house "latent print" search capability will increase from 20,000 departmental subjects to approximately 1.5 million Cal-ID subjects. Our in-house "inked print" identification capability will increase from 150,000 departmental subjects to approximately 4.5 million Cal-ID subjects. Comparisons and identifications will be performed on-site via the transmission of fingerprint images from Cal-ID.

The State of California requires resolutions be adopted by the City Council and the County Board of Supervisors authorizing the State to make the equipment purchase on behalf of the City and the County. The attached resolution has been approved for content and format by the City Attorney's Office.

FINANCIAL DATA

Projected Phase I implementation costs to the Sacramento Police Department for the Cal-ID RAN project total approximately \$63,200. The remaining balance of \$86,800 will be used in subsequent phases of implementation. The total project will remain at the budgeted level. No additional funds are requested.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the resolution authorizing the State to purchase Cal-ID RAN equipment on behalf of the City of Sacramento be adopted.

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
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
