The Honorable City Council met in Regular Session on this date at 8.45 o'clock P. M., Mayor Elkus presiding.

Roll Call was answered by following members of the Council:-

Councilmen Anderson, Brown, Elkus, Frazier, Goddard, Kiernan, John H. Miller, Royal Miller.

The Minutes of Regular Meeting of May 7th, 1925, were read and approve.

W. B. Fink, representing East Sacramento Improvement Club, addressed Council relative to extending transportation facilities in East Sacramento; that residents would be satisfied with bus line if operated by the City, and read a form of petition which he stated would be placed on the ballot at next election, in connection with which Councilman John H. Miller, representing Council Committee on street car extensions, reported that the Committee had held numerous conferences with officials of Pacific Gas & Electric Company and had succeeded in securing an Oak Park bus line which was already in operation.

Percy G. West, Attorney, addressed Council requesting favorable action on Rezoning Petition No. 77, filed by Sam G. Aron April 9th for the reclassification of Lot No. 237 of Homeland, situated at the Southeast Corner of 18th and Y Streets, from Second Residential to Commercial, stating that such request was made in order that petitioner might erect and conduct a retail grocery and butcher shop; discussed, Councilman Anderson moving that foregoing petition be granted, excepting the North ten feet of said lot in order to provide a set-back line on Y Street. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan and carried by following vote:

ment will be affected, and Councilman Kiernan contended that Council had legal right to comply with petition to rezone the two blocks and moved as a substitute that petition be granted. Seconded by Councilman Goddard who consented to withdrawal of motion and Roll Call on the original motion to postpone hearing and refer petition to City Manager carried as follows:

AYES: Councilmen Anderson, Brown, Elkus, Frazier, Goddard, Kiernan, John H. Miller, Royal Miller. ABSENT: Councilman Bidwell.

Councilman Anderson thereupon moved that City Attorney be directed to render opinion as to the power of the Council to rezone entire tract upon petition signed by only 80% of property owners and right of property owner who had purchased property in tract for uses permitted under existing Ordinance and so ordered by the Chair.

Report of City Manager on communication of property owners along 21st Street relative to opening 20th Street through Maple Park, filed May 7th, 1925, was ordered filed and the Clerk reporting that no legal protests had been filed in matter of said opening under provisions of Resolution Ordering Work No. 1951 for the opening and extending of 20th Street from northerly line of Maple Park to Freeport Boulevard, City Manager presented the following Resolution recommending adoption:

RESOLUTION ORDERING WORK NO. 1951.

"WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sacramento, did on the 15th day of January, 1925, pass its Resolution of Intention No. 1951, declaring its intention to order the following work and improvement to be done, to-wit:

"The opening and extending of 20th Street, in the City of Sacramento, from the northerly line of Maple Park (as the same is shown on the official map thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California) to FREEPORT BOULEVARD;

"By obtaining certain parcels of land more particularly described in said Resolution of Intention No. 1951, adopted on the 15th day of January, 1925, as the land necessary and convenient to be taken for said purposes.

"AND WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Streets of the City of Sacramento did thereupon cause notice of the passage of said Resolution to be posted and published for ten days, in the manner as required by law; and

"WHEREAS, no objections have been filed with the City Clerk against the proposed work and improvement and the City Council has now acquired jurisdiction to order the said work as proposed by said Resolution of Intention to be done.

"NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered that said work and improvement shall be done as aforesaid and as specifically described in said Resolution of Intention No. 1951.

"D. K. COLCLOUGH, EDWARD P. DELL AND JAY L. HENRY are hereby appointed Commissioners to assess benefits and damages and to have general supervision of the said proposed work and improvement until the completion thereof, in compliance with law."

Councilman Kiernan moved that foregoing Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Frazier and carried by following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Anderson, Frazier, Brown, Elkus, Goddard, Kiernan, John H. Miller, Royal Miller. ABSENT: Bidwell.

Upon recommendation of City Manager which was ordered filed, Councilman Frazier moved that petition of M. E. Church South, filed May 7th for construction of gutters on J Street between 14th and 15th Streets under provisions of Resolution of Intention No. 1987 be overruled. Seconded by Mayor Elkus and carried as follows:
