SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF HEARING EXAMINERS

SUMMARY

The new Nuisance Abatement Ordinance requires the selection of a panel of hearing examiners before whom nuisance abatement cases are brought for action. This report proposes a panel of hearing examiners for approval by the City Council.

BACKGROUND

The Nuisance Abatement Ordinance provides, in relevant part:

"§61.204 Hearing examiner.

In order to hear cases brought by the department head under the provisions of this code, the City Council shall appoint a panel of hearing examiners, from which one hearing examiner on a rotating basis shall hear cases brought by the department head. Such examiners shall serve at the pleasure of the City Council. A hearing examiner may not be a city employee."

In the interest of fairness and prudence, the prohibition against City employees has been expanded in order to exclude close friends, relatives and business associates of City employees and officials. All of the individuals proposed here are well-qualified and meet the criteria of the Ordinance.

If the Council approves the proposed panel, each examiner will be called to hear cases approximately once every ten weeks.

Examiners will hear cases over a period of one and one-half to three hours and be paid \$50.00 per hour.

The proposed panel consists of the following individuals:

Tom Hammer - Attorney and businessman

Dee McKenzie - Retired, former Director of Public Works, County of Sacramento

Lee Page - Clergyman and business owner

Kay Reynolds - Former Executive Assistant to the Mayor of Dallas, former Deputy Director of the California Office of Economic Development, Executive Director of the California Association for Local Economic Development

Phil Simpson - Former Planning Commissioner, former Chairman-School Impaction Fact-Finding Panel, Chief of Systems Planning for Caltrans


FISCAL DATA

It is recommended that the City Council approve the attached Resolution approving the five individuals above as the Panel of Hearing Examiners.



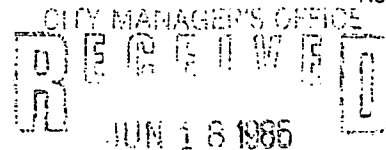


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
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
