### SUMMARY

 Approval of a grant application to the California Department of Justice, Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) for establishment of a California Community Crime Resistance Program --Community Resources Section.

- 2. The authorization for the City Manager to execute an agreement and any amendment with OCJP for the grant implementation.
- 3. The authorization for the City Manager to transfer \$61,798 from the Administrative Contingency Fund of the General Fund to the Police Department, Office of the Chief account for the purpose of implementing the first year of the grant and transferring of \$6,866 from the Police Department, Office of Administrative Services budget to the Office of the Chief's budget.

### **BACKGROUND**

The Sacramento Police Department is in the process of applying for a \$123,349 O.C.J.P. grant under the California Community Crime Resistance Program. The City of Sacramento would have to hard match this proposal by 10% or \$13,706.

The grant out of the Community Resources Section of the Office of the Chief of Police would expand the current Crime Alert Program. The program was recently co-sponsored with the Sacramento Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce in creating the Crime Alert Rewards Committee. In addition, the Community Resources Section will expand the volunteers in police service program.

The proposal would be to implement four full-time positions. Two positions will assist to produce, coordinate, and investigate the Crime Alert program and its information sources. We would triple the output of information programs including crime reenactments, wanted persons, crime patterns and crime prevention messages. Four local television stations, five radio stations, and the two newspapers would carry the messages. The other two positions will be utilized to assist in expanding the current volunteers in police service program and perform crime prevention presentations to the public.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE CITY BUDGET FOR
FY 1981/82 FOR THE CALIFORNIA
COMMUNITY CRIME RESISTANCE PROGRAM: COMMUNITY
RESOURCES SECTION - CRIME ALERT
BY \$68,664

- 1. The City budget for FY 1981/82 is hereby amended by \$53,002 to provide for the implementation of a California Department of Justice, Office of Criminal Justice Planning grant entitled "California Community Crime Resistance Program: Crime Alert".
  - A. By transferring \$61,798 from the administrative contingency fund, Budget 101-50700000-4399 to the Police Department, Office of the Chief Budget 101-1710-5185-4XXX.
  - B. By transferring \$6,866 from the Police Department, Office of Administrative Services Budget 101-1740-0000-4266 to the Office of the Chief Budget 101-1710-5185-4XXX. This amount is specified as the City's hard match contribution for FY 1981/82.
- 2. The above appropriation increase is to be supported by additional estimated revenue of \$68,664 that are forthcoming from the California Department of Justice, Office of Criminal Justice Planning which will be deposited in the General Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the city agrees to provide all matching funds required for said project (including any extension or amendment thereof) under the California Community Crime Resistance Program and the rules and regulations of OCJP and that cash match will be appropriated as required hereby.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplement law enforcement expenditures controlled by this body.
