SUBJECT: Grant Application - Career Criminal Apprehension Program
State of the Art Proposal - Major Crime Pattern and Series
Response Program

SUMMARY

This report concerns:

1. Approval of a grant application to the California Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) for a Career Criminal Apprehension Program, State of the Art Grant. This grant will provide \$50,000 for a Major Crime Pattern and Series Response Project.
2. The authorization for the City Manager to execute an agreement with OCJP for the implementation of the aforementioned State of the Art grant.
3. The authorization of the City Manager to utilize \$25,501 from the current Police Department budget as the matching funds for implementing this State of the Art grant.

BACKGROUND

A major portion of the serious crime problem existing in the City of Sacramento can be attributed to a relatively small number of multiple and repeat felony offenders often referred to as "career criminals". This problem is common in all urban areas in the State and ultimately resulted in the passage of the Career Criminal Apprehension Program (C-CAP) by the California State Legislature. The three major components of the C-CAP are in the areas of:

1. Crime Analysis
2. Managing Patrol Operations
3. Managing Criminal Investigations

Use of these C-CAP components has permitted the Police Department to slow and, in some instances, reduce the overall level of career criminal activities in the City of Sacramento. This has been accomplished by obtaining a maximum level of

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service from available police resources. One of the major side effects of stretching these resources to their limits is that we have been unable to adequately schedule officers for assignment on an as-needed basis for apprehension and suppression activities in response to major crime patterns and series.

Since no major increase in sworn personnel is presently anticipated, new means need to be developed to improve the State of the Art in the Managing Patrol Operations phase of C-CAP. What this grant will research and develop is a program which involves the proactive use of portable alarms as a means of response on major crime patterns and series. The use of these alarms would be designed to decrease response time and free officers currently restricted to limited geographic areas monitoring receivers.

FINANCIAL DATA

The total cost of this budget is \$75,501. The Office of Criminal Justice Planning grant funds will provide 66%, or \$50,000. The remaining 34%, or \$25,501, will be taken from the Police Department's existing budget and utilized as the City's matching contribution. The funds will be allocated as follows:



RECOMMENDATION


It is my recommendation that the City Council approve:



SUMMARY

Attached for your consideration and approval is a Career Criminal Apprehension Program State of the Art grant application, a letter to the City Council describing the application and a resolution to authorize the Grant. This Grant will provide funds for a Major Crime Pattern and Series Response Project -- a project which will test and improve our use of portable alarms in support of enforcement activities aimed at reducing the severity of crime patterns and series involving burglary and robbery.


BACKGROUND

A similar grant application was previously submitted and approved by the City Council requesting \$100,000 in State grant funds. Due to a lack of funds, the State Office of Criminal Justice Planning was unable to support the grant. Funds are now available for the State to support a similar grant at a reduced amount, \$50,000, which will provide 66% of the total budget. The City's matching contribution will be \$25,501, which is 34% of a total Grant budget of \$75,501.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that this grant application receive your approval. A copy of this letter and grant application are being submitted concurrently to the City Council for their approval, thereby allowing us to meet an August 1, 1984 deadline for grant submission to OCJP.
