# Measure L

Also known as the Sacramento Children and Youth Health and Safety Act

Passed by voters in 2022

Established City Charter Section 120  
– Sacramento Children’s Fund

Required the City Auditor to calculate the Baseline Funding amount

Requires the City Auditor to verify the Baseline Funding amount was expended each fiscal year

# Objective, Scope, and Methodology

- The objective of this project was to fulfill the requirement outlined in §120 Sacramento Children's Fund, section (e)(1)(C) of the Sacramento City Charter by verifying that the Baseline Funding amount of \$22.9 million was expended in fiscal year 2024/25.
- We collaborated with departments to identify youth programs and services offered in fiscal year 2024/25. We then analyzed youth program information and general ledger data to evaluate eligibility based on Measure L criteria.

# Measure L Reports

The Sacramento Children and Youth Health and Safety Act, also known as Measure L, was passed by voters in November 2022. Measure L amended the Sacramento City Charter, adding Section 120 - Sacramento Children's Fund. This page documents the City Auditor's compliance with its responsibilities outlined in Sacramento City Charter Section 120.

## City Auditor's responsibilities

The City Auditor's responsibilities primarily relate to the calculation and verification of certain financial aspects of the Sacramento Children's Fund. Specifically:

- The City Auditor shall calculate and publish the Baseline Funding amount no later than December 31, 2023;
- Beginning in 2025, by January 15 of each year, the City Auditor shall verify that the Baseline Funding amount was expended in the previous fiscal year; and
- Beginning in 2025, by January 15 of each year, the City Auditor shall publish an audited amount of the Cannabis Business Operations Tax (CBOT) for the prior fiscal year.
