SUBJECT: Appeal of the Planning Commission Approval of a Street Name Change from
Sacramento Boulevard to Martin Luther King Boulevard (M88-049)

LOCATION: Sacramento Boulevard from Broadway to Franklin Boulevard

SUMMARY

The request is to change the name of Sacramento Boulevard within the City limits to Martin L. King Boulevard. The total length is approximately three miles. Planning staff recommended against the change due to some property owners expressing opposition to the change. The request was heard by the Planning Commission which voted to approve the change. The matter is before the City Council on appeal.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Sacramento Boulevard currently runs from Broadway, south to Franklin Boulevard. The total length is approximately three miles and includes both City and County jurisdictions. The City/County boundary lies at the intersection of Fruitridge Road. The applicant requests to change the name of Sacramento Boulevard to Martin L. King Boulevard in order to honor the life's work of Dr. King. The applicant chose Sacramento Boulevard because of its diverse ethnic communities; it runs through both the City and County; and it has freeway access.

Both the General Plan and the Oak Park Redevelopment Plan designate a mixture of land uses for the three mile length of Sacramento Boulevard. Existing land uses include residential and commercial properties, several churches, three schools, a fire station, Community Center and Community Park. In all, 196+ parcels are located along the Boulevard and would be affected by the name change.

The proposed street name change was legally noticed on two occasions and staff sent out a separate questionnaire soliciting property owners opinions on the proposal. The applicant also submitted over 150 letters of support for the name change from people in and out of the immediate area. In addition, several groups and organizations have indicated support for the name change (staff will have all letters available at the Council hearing for review).

Staff's primary focus is on property owners and residents that are directly affected. Although the applicant has submitted 123 statements of support from property owners and/or residents of Sacramento Boulevard. Staff was informed through letters and phone calls that at least 45 property owners opposed the name change due to a variety of reasons, but primarily because of the hardship in which a change of address would cause.

Although staff recognized that for a name change of this size, obtaining the support of all property owners is difficult. Staff did find, however, that there remains a significant number in opposition. Following City practice which is to not change a name unless there is total support by the adjacent property owners, Planning staff recommended against the request.

The name change was routed to other City departments for comment. The City Traffic Engineer's Office indicated that if approved, the entire length should be changed, including the County portion.

The Planning Commission heard substantial testimony for and against the request. After hearing testimony, the Commission voted to approve the name change to Martin Luther King Boulevard, rather than Martin L. King Boulevard. The longer name does not fit on the standard street name plates. Subsequent to the hearing, two appeals were received.

VOTE OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION


On July 28, 1988, the Commission voted eight ayes, one absent to approve the name change.

Should the City Council concur with the staff recommendation, the appropriate action would be to approve the appeal.

SUMMARY: This is a request for a street name change for Sacramento Boulevard to
Martin L. King Boulevard.

PROJECT INFORMATION:

General Plan Designation:	commercial, offices, public/quasi-public, medium density residential, low density residential, parks.
Oak Park Redevelopment Plan:	commercial, residential-office, residential 11/21 du/na, residential 7-15 du/na, park, community center
Existing Zoning of Site:	R-1, C-1, R-2, R0, C-2, R-2B
Existing Land Use:	single family residential, apartments, commercial, office, churches, schools, parks, community center

PROJECT EVALUATION: Staff has the following comments:

- A. Sacramento Boulevard currently runs from Broadway, south to Franklin Boulevard. The total length is approximately three miles and includes both City and County jurisdictions. The City/County boundary lies at the intersection of Fruitridge Road. The applicant requests to change the name of Sacramento Boulevard to Martin L. King Boulevard in order to honor the life's work of Dr. King. The applicant chose Sacramento Boulevard because of its diverse ethnic communities; it runs through both the City and County; and it has freeway access.
- B. Both the General Plan and the Oak Park Redevelopment Plan designate several various land uses for the three mile length of Sacramento Boulevard. Existing land uses include residential and commercial properties. Several churches, three schools, including Christian Brothers High School, a fire station, Community Center and Community Park are all located along Sacramento Boulevard. In all, 196+ parcels are located along the Boulevard and would be affected by the name change.

- C. The proposed street name change was legally noticed on two occasions and staff sent out a separate questionnaire soliciting property owner's opinion on the proposal. All mail outs were based on the required property ownership list that must be submitted by the applicant.

The applicant has submitted over 150 letters of support for the name change from people all over the Sacramento area. In addition, several groups and organizations have indicated support for the name change. However, staff's primary concern are those property owners and residents that are directly affected. The applicant has submitted 123 statements of support from property owners and/or residents of Sacramento Boulevard. Staff has been informed through letters and phone calls that at least 35 property owners oppose the name change due to a variety of reasons, but primarily, because of the undue hardship in which a change of address would cause. Staff also, has come to the conclusion that the position of several property owners has not been determined. The burden of proof to determine the position of property owners regarding street name changes is placed on the applicant. Based on the information submitted to staff, not all property owners along the three mile length of the Boulevard have indicated a position.

- D. The proposal for the street name change was reviewed by City Traffic Engineering, City Building Division, City Fire Department and the County of Sacramento Mapping Section. The following comments were received.

Traffic Engineering

The City Traffic Engineer has no objection to changing the name of Sacramento Boulevard to Martin L. King Boulevard provided the entire length from Broadway to Franklin Boulevard, including County portion is changed. Nearly one half of the street is outside the city.

County of Sacramento - Mapping Section

Approval for a persons full name used as a street name would require special approval since no provision exists in the County street name ordinance. Any approval by the County would be contingent on City approval. The entire length of the street must have the same name.

City Building and Fire Divisions have no objections to the proposal.

- E. It has been the policy of the city to strongly consider the concerns of property owners and residents along streets proposed for name changes. Staff has not been convinced that a significant number of property owners and/or residents of Sacramento Boulevard are not in opposition to warrant the name change. Although, staff recognizes the applicant's intent to honor Dr. King and supports the idea in principle, because of

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the hardship put on the property owners and residents of Sacramento Boulevard, staff recommends against the street name change. Staff suggests the applicant name a street in a new subdivision of the City or County.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: This project is exempt from environmental review pursuant to State EIR Guidelines (CEQA, Section 15061 b1).

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: It has been staff's policy not to support a street name change unless the change has the unanimous support of the adjoining property owners. In this case, there is significant opposition to the request. Staff therefore, must recommend the City Planning Commission deny the street name change from Sacramento Boulevard to Martin L. King Boulevard. Staff suggest that the applicant work with the City to investigate alternative ways to honor Dr. King.

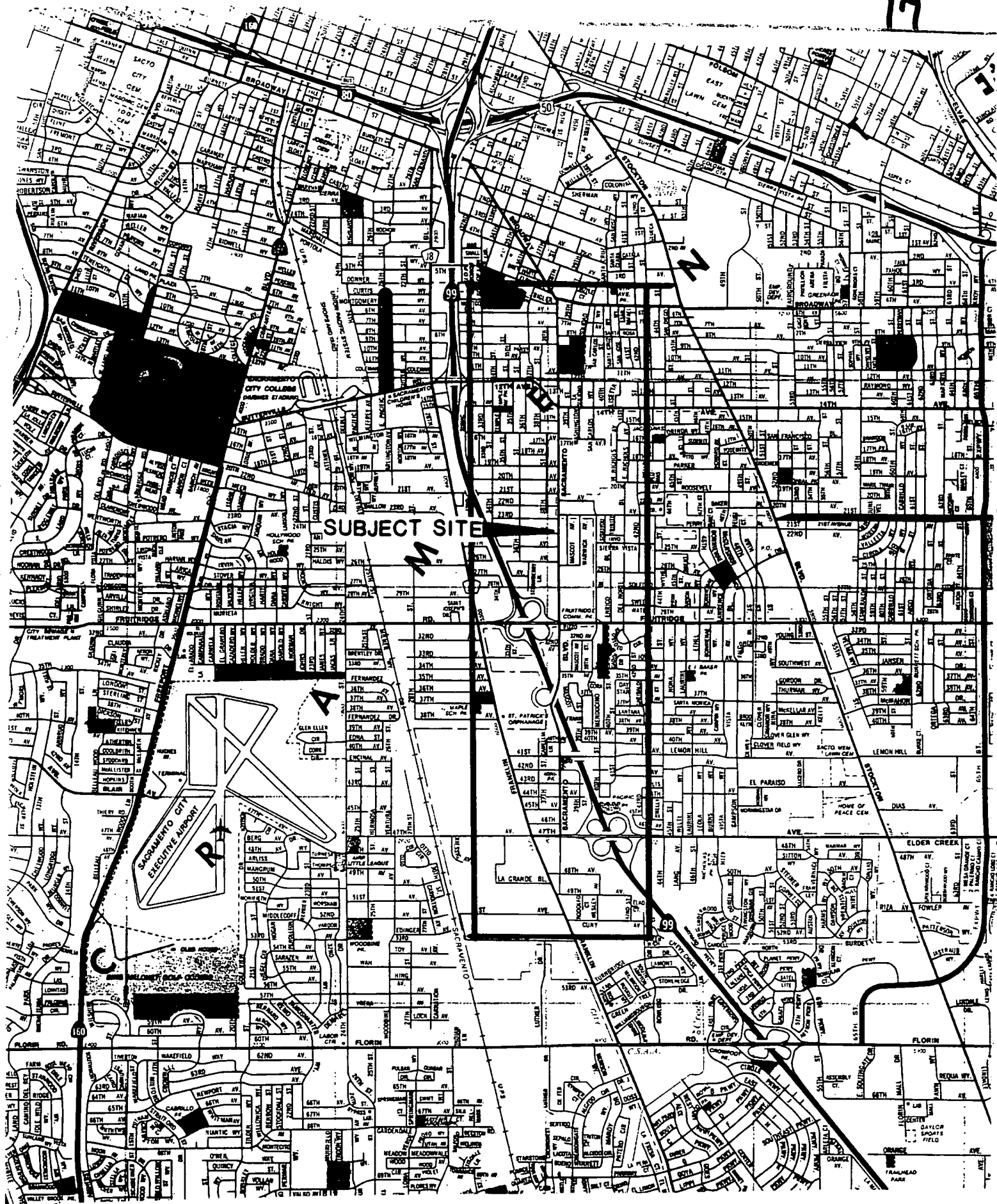


