WHEREAS, Sacramento-Yolo Camp Fire Boys and Girls offer co-educational programs for youth with a philosophy which recognizes individual accomplishments, encourages creativity and appreciation of the world around us, and promotes citizenship, service to others and development of self-reliance skills; and

WHEREAS, approximately 50 children in the Florin Meadows apartment complex, located in an economically disadvantaged neighborhood, now participate Monday through Friday from 3:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. in the Camp Fire program; and

WHEREAS, the Camp Fire program includes tutoring and homework time, games, arts and crafts, teen activities, Florin Meadows Drill Team, summer camp, and special events enabling children to learn proper decision-making skills, responsibility and goal setting and improved self-image, resulting in a decreased probability of involvement with drugs and gangs; and

WHEREAS, 15 boys and girls were able to experience a week at the Sacramento-Yolo Camp Fire Boys and Girls resident summer camp, Minaluta, through their participation in the after school program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the Council of the City of Sacramento that we hereby commend the Sacramento-Yolo Camp Fire Boys and Girls for providing the after school enrichment program at the Florin Meadows apartment complex and encourage their continued support;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we recognize the boys and girls who participate in the Florin Meadows after school enrichment program and applaud their efforts to better themselves.
