Background

- * **June 2015** – City Council allocates \$1M of Measure U funds to address gang violence
- * **September 2015** – City Council adopts strategic framework for the Gang Prevention & Intervention Task Force
- * **October 2015** – Hired director for Task Force
- * **December 2015** – Released RFP to expand programs for target populations

RFP Overview

- * Total available funding: **\$680K**
- * Grant awards: **\$25-90K**
- * Total number of proposals: **36**
- * Total amount requested: **\$2.5 million**
- * Total number of awards: **18**



RFP Framework: Target Populations

- *At-Risk*
low income, low academics, low family support
- *High-Risk*
drug use, lives in gang neighborhood, behavior issues
- *Gang Involved*
self-identifies (tattoo), system involved, gang family
- *Hard-Core*
validated, gang-crime offender, incarcerated

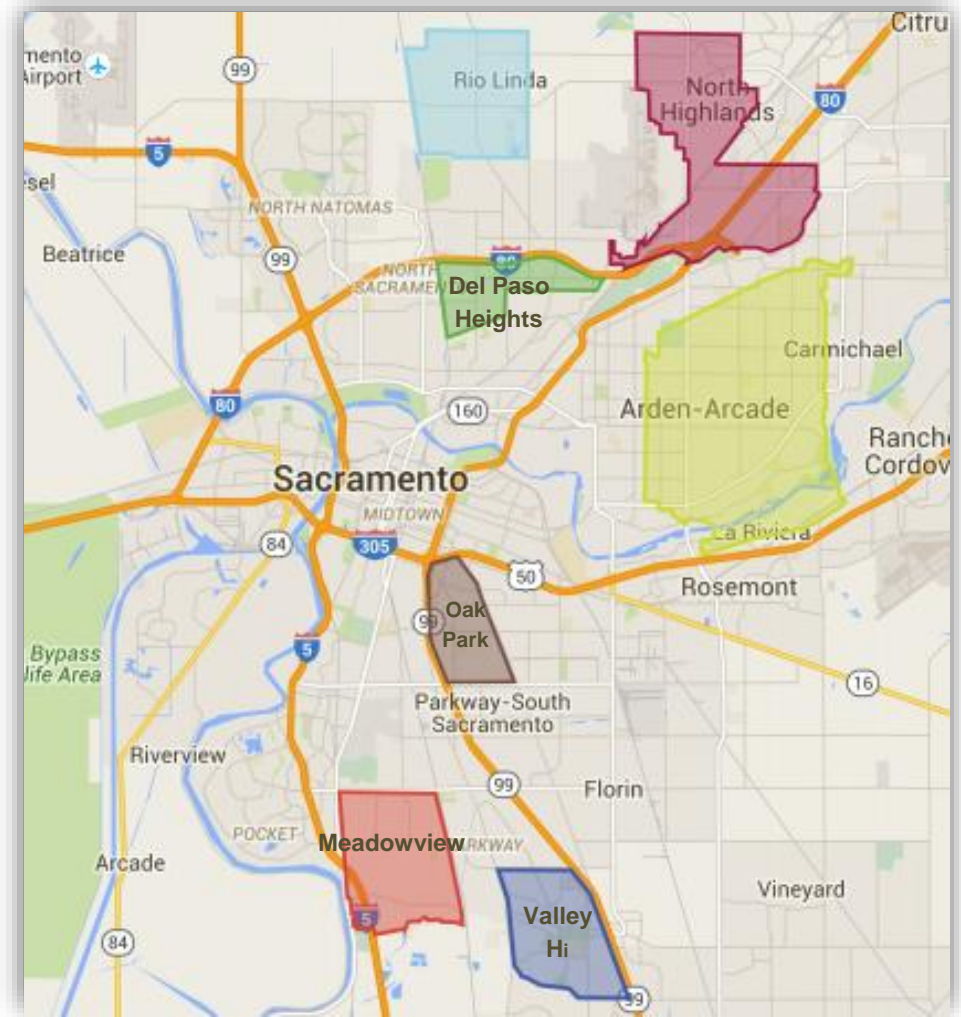

 - ✓ Agency Capacity
 - ✓ Demonstration of Need
 - ✓ Program Design
 - ✓ Outcomes
- * Three-step process:
 - ✓ Individual review
 - ✓ City Staff compiled and analyzed results
 - ✓ Group determination of recommendations
