SUBJECT: Morrison Creek Assessment District Improvement Proceeding No. 5068

SUMMARY

It is requested that the City Council adopt various Resolutions to enable the commencement of construction of the proposed improvement for Morrison Creek Assessment District. Adoption of the Resolution is recommended.

#### BACKGROUND

On December 18, 1984, the Council commenced the assessment proceeding for Morrison Creek Assessment District by adopting several Resolutions, which set January 29, 1985 as the date for bids to be received and February 12, 1985 as the Hearing date. The results of the bids were presented to the Council on February 12, 1985 and as there were oral and written protests, the Hearing was continued until March 12, 1985. At the March 12, 1985 Hearing the Council overruled all protests and confirmed the assessment.

The property owners within the District have been billed for their assessed amount and were given the required 30 days in which to pay their assessment pursuant to law. The last day for payment was April 15, 1985. The total amount of unpaid assessments is now known (\$5,393,550.67) and we are ready to issue bonds and award the contract.

#### FINANCIAL DATA

The project is estimated to cost \$7,509,985.39 with the property owners within the District paying \$6,693,062.89 and the County of Sacramento paying \$716,922.50. There are no City Funds proposed to be expended for this project. A summary of the project cost is as follows:

#### SUMMARY

In compliance with the underwriting agreement with the firms of Stone & Youngberg and Birr Wilson & Co., Inc. dated January 15, 1985, I have received and reviewed the bid on the above-described assessment distrtict. I recommend award of the bonds to the firms of Stone & Youngberg and Birr Wilson & Co., Inc. in compliance with the attached bid which is equivalent to a net interest cost of 10.01029% on the bonds, inclusive of all costs and expenses.

#### BACKGROUND

In compliance with the underwriting agreement dated January 15, 1985 and adopted by Council, the firms of Stone & Youngberg and Birr Wilson & Co., Inc. submitted a bid (see attached) in compliance with the terms of the underwriting agreement, including coupon and discount. The proposed bid results in an average coupon of 9.654% on the bonds, but including a 3 1/2% discount for all costs and expenses results in a net interest cost of 10.01029%. Further, the bond issue provides for a 10% reserve account.

In reviewing the proposed bid I determined that U. S. Treasury government securities were trading at a yield of approximately 11.20% and other similar assessment districts were trading in the approximate 10.10% area. Therefore, the bid submitted by Stone & Youngberg and Birr Wilson & Co., Inc. is favorable as compared to other indicators of interest rates at this time.



The proposed bid for the Morrison Creek Assessment District bonds was submitted to the City Treasurer's Office on April 18, 1985. Subsequently, there was a bond market rally. Stone & Youngberg and Birr Wilson & Co., Inc. arbitrarily submitted another bid proposal (amended Exhibit A). Effectively, this bid proposal results in a net interest cost of 9.855447% and savings in interest cost to property owners of approximately \$82 thousand over the life of the issue.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The Treasurer recommends Council approval of this amended bid as opposed to the bid described in the April 18, 1985 correspondence.

The following notes shall be considered to be added to plan sheet 17-B and apply to the construction of the proposed drain pipe indicated thereon: and the state of the second second

- 1. The Contractor shall cut down, remove, and dispose of four Eucalyptus trees located along an existing property line approximately 7.5 feet north of the center line of the proposed 24 inch diameter drain pipe. The 4 trees are estimated to be between station 43 + 30(+) and station 45 + 30(+/-). The Contractor shall consider the cost of removal and disposal of the trees in the unit cost of furnishing and placing the nearby drainage pipe.
