SUBJECT: STATE SURCHARGE INCREASE - UNDERGROUND TANKS

SUMMARY

The California Legislature has increased the State surcharge on underground tanks from Twenty-eight dollars (\$28.00) to Fifty-six dollars (\$56.00) effective July 1, 1985.

BACKGROUND

In compliance with State law, the City of Sacramento is required to collect the established State surcharge from applicants who file for a permit to operate an underground storage tank or to renew or amend such permits within the jurisdiction of the City of Sacramento.

The Underground Tank Program is administered by the Health Department, Environmental Health Branch, County of Sacramento as a joint program involving the Sacramento County Air Pollution Control District, and all fire departments in the City and County of Sacramento. In compliance with State law, the City of Sacramento is required to collect the established State surcharge from applicants who file for a permit to operate an underground storage tank or to renew or amend such permits. On June 18, 1985, the State Water Resources Control Board notified the Sacramento County Health Department to initiate the collection of the new surcharge beginning July 1, 1985. The attached resolution will resolve the issue without requiring change in future years. (Change to Item E only.)

RESOLUTION NO. 85-577

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING FEES FOR UNDERGROUND STORAGE FACILITIES FOR HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

WHEREAS, Chapter 16 of the Sacramento City Code establishes standards for construction and monitoring of facilities used for the underground storage of hazardous substances;

WHEREAS, permits are required for each facilities, with fees therefore to be set by resolution of the City Council;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Sacramento:

Permit fees for underground storage facilities for hazardous substances are set as follows:

A. FEES FOR INITIAL PERMIT TO OPERATE:

- 1. New facilities, or modifications to existing facilities: One hundred sixty dollars (\$160.00) plus fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each tank over the first tank.

EXCEPTION: Facilities not requiring an AIR POLLUTION CONTROL DISTRICT permit: Ninety dollars (\$90.00) plus fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each tank over the first tank.

These fees include no more than three (3) inspections. Additional reinspections, if required, shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00) per hour billable in quarter hour segments with a minimum charge of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per inspection.

- 2. New installations using leak interceptor systems: Additional fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) plus thirty dollars (\$30.00) per hour inspection fee billable in quarter hour segments with a minimum fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per inspection.
- 3. Existing facilities: Ninety dollars (\$90.00).
- 4. Transfer of ownership for an existing valid Permit to operate: Eighty dollars (\$80.00).

B. ANNUAL REVIEW FEE

Every person with a valid Permit to Operate an underground storage facility for hazardous substances shall pay an annual review fee in the amount of eighty dollars (\$80.00), which shall include one inspection. Additional inspections, if required, will be billed at thirty dollars (\$30.00) per hour in quarter hour segments, with a minimum fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per inspection.

C. ABANDONMENT FEES

Every person determining to permanently close an underground storage facility for hazardous substances shall pay a fee of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per facility.

D. APPEAL FILING FEE

The fee for filing an appeal of the denial or revocation of a Permit to Operate, or the conditions placed thereon, is one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00).

E. STATE SURCHARGE

An annual surcharge of fifty-six dollars (\$56.00) or any future consideration as established by the Legislature for each underground storage tank is imposed by the State of California and must be collected by the City. This fee is in addition to any other fees collected.
