SUBJECT: RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR DISQUALIFICATION  
AND REMOVAL OF BOARD AND COMMISSION MEMBERS FOR FAILURE TO  
FILE REQUIRED STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS

SUMMARY

The attached resolution provides for: (i) disqualification of a City board or commission member thirty days after the member has failed to file the required Statement of Economic Interests; and (ii) removal of the member pursuant to City Charter Section 232, where the failure to file persists for sixty days after the final filing date.

BACKGROUND

Several board/commission members have neglected to file Statements of Economic Interests, as required by Resolution 87-108. In order to secure compliance, the Political Reform Act of 1974 gives the City Clerk authority to impose specified fines and gives the appointing agency the authority to take other disciplinary action. The City Attorney has advised that in order to disqualify a member, and ultimately to remove the member, the resolution adopting the Conflict of Interest Code for City boards and commissions (Resolution 77-680) should be amended to specifically include this authority. The attached resolution provides for disqualification after thirty days and for removal after sixty days. Removal procedures must comply with City Charter Section 232, as specified in the attached resolution.


RECOMMENDATION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1.

Resolution 77-680, adopted October 25, 1977, is amended to add Section 1100, to read as follows:

Section 1100. Failure to File

Any board or commission member who fails to timely file a required Statement of Economic Interests is subject to fine in accordance with the provisions of the Political Reform Act of 1974, together with any other penal or remedial measure authorized by that Act. Where the board or commission member's failure to file persists for more than thirty days after the final filing date, the City Clerk shall forthwith notify the member that he or she is disqualified from any participation in meetings or other activities of the board or commission, until the member both files the required statement and pays any fines associated with the failure to file. If the member's failure to file and/or pay the associated fine persists for more than sixty days after the final filing date, the member shall be removed from the board or commission pursuant to the procedures specified in City Charter Section 232.

SECTION 1.

Resolution 77-680, adopted October 25, 1977, is amended to add Section 1100, to read as follows:

Section 1100. Failure to file
