SUBJECT: Underground Utility District No. 2, Stockton Boulevard
between U.S. Highway 50 and Broadway (JN:1207) - Public
Hearing and District Formation

SUMMARY

A hearing has been set for this date on the formation of the proposed district. Upon closing of the hearing, it is recommended that the attached resolution establishing the district be approved. This requires a 4/5 vote of the City Council.

BACKGROUND

A public hearing has been set to consider the formation of the Utility Undergrounding District No. 2 on Stockton Blvd. from State Route US 50 to Broadway as shown in Exhibit A. On January 9, 1990, the Council commenced the proceedings for the proposed district by adopting Resolution No. 90-045, setting the hearing for this date. On January 10, 1990, a public notice was mailed to property owners and affected utilities advising them of the proposed undergrounding district.

FINANCIAL DATA

The estimated financial impact to the City will be \$50,000 for the undergrounding of the City overhead fire alarm system. These funds are not available at this time, but will be requested as part of the 1990\91 CIP program, prior to project construction.

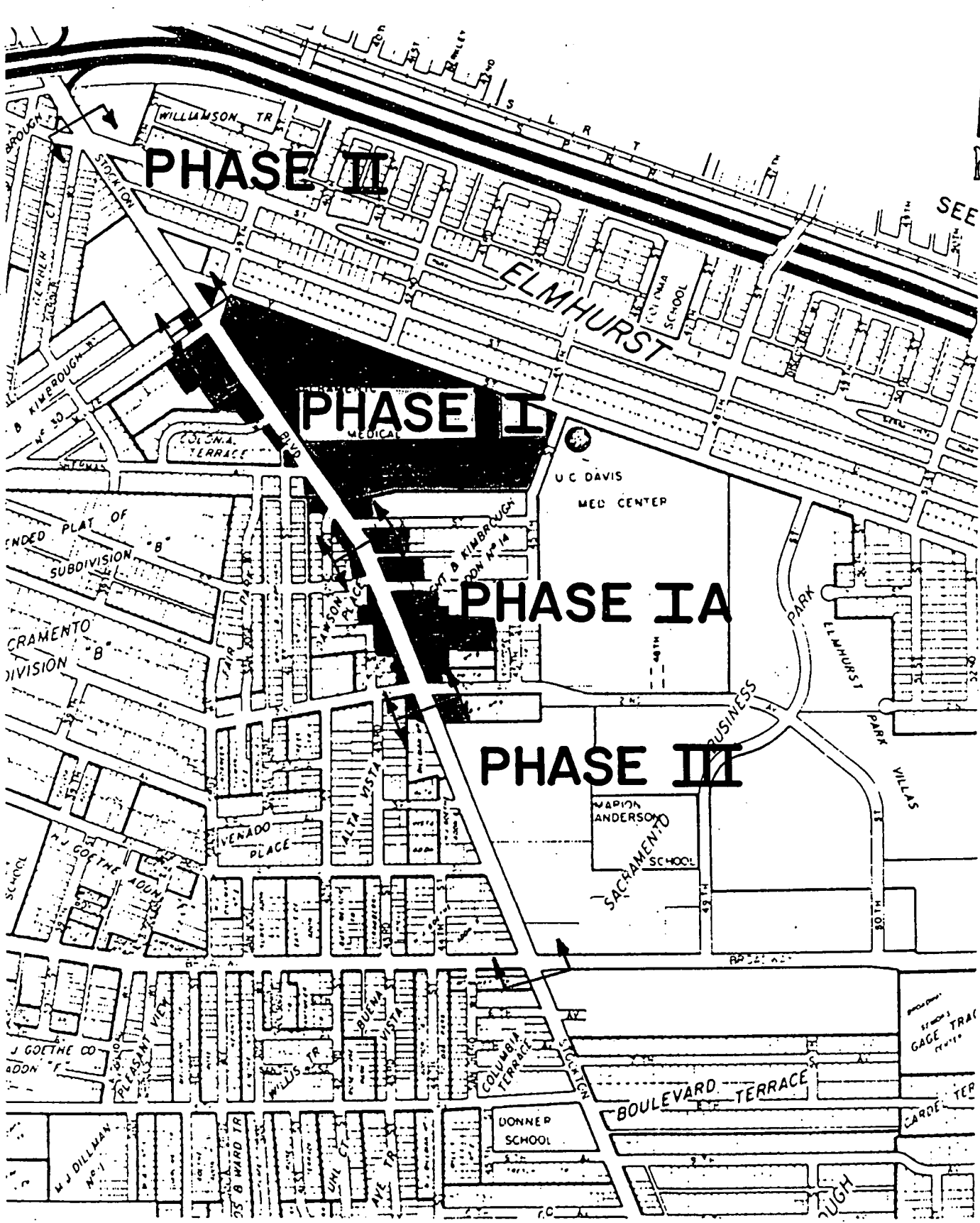

**RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING
UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 2
IN THE
CITY OF SACRAMENTO**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. _____, a public hearing was called for Tuesday, January 30, 1990, at the hour of 7:30 (p.m.), in the Council Chamber, City Hall, 915 I Street, Sacramento, California, to ascertain whether the public necessity, health, safety, or welfare required the removal of poles, overhead wires, and associated overhead structures, and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, or similar or associated service, within that certain area of the City described as follows:

On Stockton Boulevard from U.S. Highway 50 to Broadway, as shown in Exhibit A.; and

WHEREAS, notice of such hearing was given to all affected property owners as shown on the last equalized assessment roll and to all affected utilities, in the manner and for the time required by law; and

WHEREAS, such hearing was duly held, and all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard.

WHEREAS, the Council determined after hearing on the subject that the Underground Utility District herein created is in the general public interest for the following reasons:

- (1) The undergrounding to be accomplished will avoid or eliminate an unusually heavy concentration of overhead distribution facilities which the Council finds is a public necessity and will enhance the safety of the streets in the proposed district.

- (2) The streets, roads, or rights-of-way in the District are extensively used by the general public and carry a heavy volume of pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council and the City of Sacramento that, pursuant to Ordinance No. 86-006 of the City of Sacramento, the above-described area is hereby declared an Underground Utility District, and is designated as Underground Utility District No. 2 of the City of Sacramento. Attached hereto, marked Exhibit "A", and hereby incorporated as a part of this resolution, is a map delineating the boundaries of said District:

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the Council does hereby fix November 1, 1991 as the date on which all effected property owners in the area, designated Phases I and IA, must be ready to receive underground service, and does hereby order the removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, or similar or associated service within Underground Utility District No. 2 Phases I and IA on or before December 31, 1991.

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that each property owner in the Underground Utility District No. 2 shall be responsible for the installation and maintenance of the conduit and termination loop on, under, or within that property.

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the City Clerk is hereby instructed to notify all affected utilities and all persons owning real property within Underground Utility District No. 2, Phases I and IA, of the adoption of this resolution within ten (10) days after the date of such adoption. Said City Clerk shall further notify said property owners of the necessity that, if they or any person occupying such property desire to continue to receive electric, communication, or other similar or associated service, they or such occupant shall, by the date fixed in this resolution, provide all necessary facility changes on their premises so as to receive such service from the lines of the supplying utility or utilities at a new location, subject to applicable rules,

regulations, and tariffs of the respective utility or utilities on file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California. Such notification shall be made by mailing a copy of this resolution together with a copy of said Ordinance No. 86-006, to affected property owners as such are shown on the last equalized assessment roll and to the affected utilities.
