SUBJECT: Appeal of Donald L. O'Connor from the decision of the Housing Codes Advisory and Appeals Board

#### SUMMARY

Attached is the appeal of Donald L. O'Connor from the decision of the Housing Codes Advisory and Appeals Board regarding 1107 Ninth Street (the Forum Building) in the City of Sacramento, which the Board found to be in violation of City Code Chapter 50 (Dangerous Buildings Code) in a resolution adopted by the Council on April 8, 1981, as required by Section 50.501(a), Sacramento City Code.

Under Sections 2.323 and 2.324 of the City Code, the Council may appoint a hearing examiner to hear the appeal if it finds that "the appeal may involve a lengthy factfinding process which would be more appropriately accommodated by a formal hearing before a hearing examiner."

#### FINANCIAL DATA

The estimated cost would be \$195.00 and would be available from the Building Inspections budget.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

1. If the Council should decide to appoint a hearing examiner, it is recommended that the following motion be adopted: "The


