SUBJECT: ALLOCATION OF FUNDS FOR IMPLEMENTATION PLAN SERVICES

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT

Redevelopment Areas City-wide, all Council Districts.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Staff recommends that:

- the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Sacramento adopt a resolution allocating tax increment funds in the amount of \$41,395 for implementation plan preparation;
- the City Council adopt a resolution amending the City's budget and allocating Community Development Block Grant Funds in the amount of \$9,700 for implementation plan preparation; and
- the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission adopt a resolution, contingent upon City Council approval of the recommendation noted above, authorizing the Executive Director to transfer \$9,700 from City Community Development Block Grant Contingency funds to Administration funds for the preparation of implementation plans for each City redevelopment area.

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SUMMARY

Recent revisions to the California Redevelopment Law requires that redevelopment agencies must adopt a five-year implementation plan for each redevelopment area. This report recommends an allocation of funds for the preparation of implementation plans for all nine City and County redevelopment areas.

COMMISSION ACTION

At its meeting of May 4, 1994, the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission adopted a motion recommending approval of the attached resolutions. The votes were as follows:

BACKGROUND

Assembly Bill 1290 became effective January 1, 1994, and made a number of major revisions to the California Redevelopment Law ("CRL"). One of those revisions is the requirement that each redevelopment agency must adopt a five-year implementation plan for each of its project areas adopted prior to December 31, 1993. The implementation plan must include the following information:

- An identification of the specific goals and objectives for the project area;
- An identification of the specific proposed projects and expenditures to occur in the next five years;
- An explanation of how the goals and objectives as well as the proposed project/expenditures will eliminate blight;
- An explanation of how the goals and objectives as well as the proposed project/expenditures will implement the CRL's low- and moderate-income housing provision, and includes:
 - an annual housing program which provides a basis for measuring performance;

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- the number of housing units developed, rehabilitated, price-restricted, otherwise assisted, or destroyed;
- a description of the Agency's plans for using its annual deposits to the Low- and Moderate-Income Housing Fund; and
- if the proposed projects will cause the destruction of low- and moderate-income housing units, proposed locations suitable for replacement housing units.

At their core, the implementation plans are essentially a presentation of the plans, projects and programs which Agency staff has already developed and put on line or has incorporated in the planning process for each of our areas. They are in fact, our adopted redevelopment programs.

Agency staff has worked to develop these programs in conjunction with the various Project Area Committees and the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission over the years. We believe them to be solid and do not envision a major revisitation of basic goals, objectives, projects and programs in the AB 1290 process.

Nevertheless, the reporting format and detailed requirements of AB 1290 will entail a major administrative burden which we did not build into this year's budget. Additionally, the findings regarding how our projects specifically address the problems of blight must be very detailed and legally specific. Since our planners must remain focussed on project implementation, we believe it necessary to bring in a special consultant to organize and prepare the detailed plans required.

The initial implementation plans for existing project areas must be considered at a public meeting and adopted prior to December 31, 1994. Subsequent implementation plans must be prepared and adopted every five years. During the intervening third year of an implementation plan's fiveyear duration, a hearing must be held on each redevelopment plan and the progress of the current implementation plan. Additionally, although not specifically authorized in AB 1290, the implementation plan may need to be amended as project needs change or unanticipated opportunities or problems arise.

Request For Proposals

On April 20, 1994, the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission authorized the Executive Director to issue a Request For Proposals (RFP) for the preparation of implementation plans as required by AB 1290 for all City and County Redevelopment Areas. On April 21, 1994, the RFP was sent to appropriate firms listed in the Agency Resource Library and in the JCP Directory as well as advertised on the Agency BIDLINE. Review of proposals will take place on May 16, 1994 through May 18, 1994, and the Council will be advised of the selected consultant.

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FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The completion of the implementation plans for both City and County areas will require an expenditure of funds not to exceed \$80,000. City Community Development Block Grant funds in the amount of \$9,700 are being proposed for the preparation of an implementation plan for the North Sacramento Redevelopment Project. Tax increment funds totalling \$41,395 are being proposed for the preparation of implementation plans for the Downtown, Richards Boulevard, Alkali Flats, Del Paso Heights, and Oak Park Redevelopment Projects. The balance will come from the County.

A transfer of City CDBG Contingency funds to Administration funds will also be required to contract with a consultant, once selected, for the preparation of implementation plans for each City redevelopment area.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The action proposed in this staff report is consistent with previously approved policy and no new policies are being recommended.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The proposed action does not constitute a project under CEQA per Guidelines Section 15378(b)(3), and is exempt from NEPA per 58.34 (a)(2).

<u>M/WBE</u>

The RFP was sent to appropriate firms listed in the Agency Resource Library and in the JCP Directory as well as advertised on the Agency BIDLINE. In addition, the Agency's five percent point preference will apply to eligible M/WBE firms and/or firms meeting the Agency's M/WBE goals for professional services.
