SUMMARY

The Sacramento Employment and Training Agency Governing Board has approved one action that requires the review and approval of your body before such action is considered final and authorized.

BACKGROUND

The Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement under Section 18(a)(1) calls for the review and approval by the signatories to the Agreement before the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency can receive funds in addition to those from the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act.

Earlier this year, the Sacramento area received \$369,500 of Emergency Food and Shelter Program funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for distribution to private non-profit agencies. These funds were allocated by an ad-hoc board composed of representatives from the American Red Cross, Catholic Social Services, Interfaith Services Bureau, Jewish Federation, Salvation Army and United Way.

On July 5, 1983, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors received an announcement from the State Department of Social Services that Sacramento County had been allocated \$151,986 of FEMA funds for emergency food and shelter programs. At the July 12, 1983 Board of Supervisors meeting, the FEMA funds were accepted and SETA was designated the agency to administer the funds.

On July 22, 1983, the Governing Board of the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency voted to accept the FEMA funds and recommend approval of this action by the Sacramento City Council.



Subject: FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY - EMERGENCY FOOD AND SHELTER PROGRAM
(Separate Item - Off Agenda)

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Acceptance of the Federal Award for Emergency Food and Shelter
2. Designation of SETA as the distribution agency.

DISCUSSION:

On July 5, 1983, we received an announcement from the State Department of Social Services that Sacramento County had been allocated \$151,986 for the Emergency Food and Shelter Program. The Board of Supervisors may elect or reject this award. If your Board rejects the award, the amount of assistance targeted for Sacramento County will be allocated to the United Way.

Earlier this year, the Sacramento area received \$369,500 for distribution to private non-profit agencies. The community developed an Ad-Hoc Board composed of representatives from the American Red Cross, Catholic Social Services, Interfaith Services Bureau, the Jewish Federation, Salvation Army, the United Way and the County.

This Ad-Hoc Board received requests from many community organizations and did an admirable job of allocating the monies. The requests were in excess of the allocation and the Board proportionately distributed funds to applicant agencies.

Currently, the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency is operating many Community Action Programs designed to serve the target population contemplated by this program. SETA oversees emergency housing and utility programs operated by community-based programs. Designation of SETA would ensure distribution of emergency food and shelter funds. This agency has distributed Community Services Block Grant Funds and will distribute Targeted Refugee Assistance Funds as well. Given the linkage this agency has with potential providers, I feel that they can distribute these funds in an expeditious and timely manner.

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


