Dear Mayor Rudin;

The Camellia Festival is an institution in the annual activities of Sacramento and its environs. As with other community activities, the Festival succeeds or fails dependent upon the ability of the parent organization to plan, develop, schedule and coordinate the many functions which, together, make up a festival. The Camellia Festival Association therefore solicits ten thousand dollars, annually, in whole or in kind, to accomplish its tasks.

We recognize the value of services rendered by the City of Sacramento to the Camellia Festival Association for such units of its program as the Parade, the Folk Dancers' Exhibition, the annual Camellia Show and the International Friendship Committee. Without the splendid cooperation of your City departments and the Sacramento Community Convention Center organization our efforts to engage the people of Sacramento in the annual Festival, and to attract many thousands of outsiders to the City, would be negated. These 'services' are worth an in-kind-value in the range of five thousand dollars.

Thus, we are modifying our request and asking for an annual cash donation of five thousand dollars to further the Association efforts on behalf of a better City and for the benefit of its citizens. Ours is a Festival by and for people. We think it appropriate that a people activity be supported by people tax dollars.

In 1985 the Camellia Parade attracted 3,200 participants and over 10,000 spectators. The Camellia Show displayed 7,000 blooms for the enjoyment of 12,000 viewers. The International Friendship Luncheon brought together 700 persons of 17 national/ethnic groups. The Folk Dancers' Exhibition was watched by 4,500 spectators. Our Bicycle Race and "Blisters" run each involved several hundred participants with several thousands as spectators.


All told we estimate that almost 10,000 persons worked, acted, performed or otherwise were involve in the '85 Camellia Festival. In the order of 60,000 spectators shared in these two dozen events or activities.


All of this is currently coordinated by one paid staff person - our Executive Director Peggy Price - and implemented by the dozens of volunteers. With an expended part-time

staff specializing in development, promotion and event direction, we believe we can increase the participation by 25% and double the number of spectators.

We will be pleased to meet informally with you and/or members of the City Council and to appear at scheduled Council hearings to amplify this appeal and to respond to your comments and suggestions. Thank you for your consideration of this formal request for an appropriation of five thousand dollars for the support of a better Camellia Festival in March of 1986.
