SUBJECT: Crocker Art Museum Division - Deaccessioning Works of Art

SUMMARY

This report recommends that the City Council adopt the resolution to deaccession three works of art from the collection of the Crocker Art Museum.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On April 20, 1982, City Council adopted the Crocker Art Museum's deaccession policy, outlining the process and criteria for removing art works from the City of Sacramento's collection held in trust by the Crocker Art Museum. In accordance with this policy, three works of art are recommended for deaccession. The works are unrelated to the Crocker's areas of collecting or lack artistic merit.

Exhibit A lists the works of art recommended for deaccession. The deaccession of these works was recommended by Museum staff and approved by the Collections and Acquisitions Committee at their meetings of February 9 and March 9, 1987.
