

ORDINANCE NO. 637, FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE NO. 30, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED NOVEMBER 3, 1921, AND ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR TWO OR MORE PERSONS TO OBSTRUCT THE SIDEWALKS OR THE STREETS, OR TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETINGS THEREON, OR TO PARADE THROUGH THE STREETS IN A BODY WITHOUT HAVING A WRITTEN PERMIT SO TO DO; PROHIBITING UNLAWFUL ASSEMBLIES AND MEETINGS THAT MAY LEAD TO BREACHES OF THE PEACE; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 285, THIRD SERIES, PASSED APRIL 12, 1917" AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 30, Fourth Series, is hereby amended to read as follows:


SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful within the limits of the City of Sacramento, except as hereinafter provided, for two or more persons to obstruct the sidewalks or streets, or to hold meetings thereon, or public celebrations therein, or to parade in a body through the public streets without first obtaining written permission therefor from the City Manager.

Provided, that all permits issued by the City Manager hereunder, shall designate the time when, and the particular locality at which any meetings may be held, and the time when, and the streets upon which any parade may be conducted.


SECTION 2. This ordinance is hereby made an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately, said emergency being that said Plaza has become a place where incendiary speeches are made, and it is deemed best to exclude all speeches under permit of the City Manager.
