SUBJECT: WILLOWCREEK ASSESSMENT DISTRICT #94-03, AUTHORIZE SALE OF

BONDS AND AWARD OF CONTRACT

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

The Willowcreek Assessment District is located within the South Natomas Community Plan area in Council District #1 (please see attached Exhibit A). The district includes 43 parcels of undeveloped land just west of the Natomas Main Drainage Canal and south of Interstate 80.

RECOMMENDATION:

SUMMARY:

This report requests that the City Council adopt the attached resolutions to finalize authorization of the sale of bonds and award the construction contract.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:

None.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

This district will provide the funding necessary to construct a drainage pump station outfall structure at the Sacramento River. A second district which will provide the remaining infrastructure for the area is scheduled for Council this summer.

On March 14, 1995, the City Council held a public hearing, approved the assessment district and levied assessments. A Petition for Writ of Mandate was filed against the City of Sacramento that challenged the formation of the assessment district on CEQA grounds. On November 20, 1995, the Petition was denied by the Sacramento County Superior Court. On August 18, 1995, the City commenced an eminent domain action to acquire property necessary for the project. In conjunction with the condemnation action, the court issued an Order for Immediate Possession in favor of the City. Pursuant to this Order, the City is entitled to take possession of the property subject to the condemnation action at this time.

The project was originally bid in January 1995 and those bids have expired. The project was re-bid on March 20, 1996, as summarized below:

has determined that Sierra National performed an adequate GFE and recommends award.

The low bid of \$561,321 submitted by Sierra National Construction is within 4% of the original engineer's estimate of \$540,000.

Notices of Assessment were mailed on March 17, 1995, to all property owners giving them an opportunity to pay their assessment in cash. The cash payment period ended on April 17, 1995. The City Treasurer has determined that the amount of assessments remaining unpaid is \$1,412,589.69 and requests authorization to issue bonds to represent the unpaid assessments.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The funds necessary for this project will be provided by the revenue that is forthcoming from the sale of bonds, money received during the cash collection period, and a contribution by the Natomas Unified School District. The revenue and expenditure budget of \$1,537,518.81 (\$1,505,810.63 the amount assessed to the property owners, plus \$76,882.50 received from the school district, minus \$45,174.32 for the bond discount) was established on May 9, 1995. A summary of the estimated project costs are as follows:

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATION:

The Environmental Services Section has advised that the improvements to be constructed have been evaluated in the Natomas West Assessment District EIR.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

The procedures under which this district is being formed are set forth in the California Streets and Highways Code, specifically Division 12 entitled, "Municipal Improvement Act of 1913" and Division 10 entitled, "Improvement Bond Act of 1915."

MBEWBE:

To encourage minority participation, plans and specifications were sent to 7 plan rooms and construction services organization for publication. Four are directly involved with MBE/WBE construction firms. Staff actively recruited available MBE/WBE firms to participate in the bid process. The project was announced on the Project Information Line which contains information on Public Works and Utility Department projects Project notices were sent to 29 organizations involved in MBE/WBE recruitment. Sierra National Construction exceeded the MBE participation goals, did not meet the WBE participation, but did perform an acceptable good faith effort.



The City Council of the City of Sacramento has received public bids for the construction of improvements in Willowcreek Assessment District No. 94-03, City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of Caiifornia.

The Engineer of Work has reviewed the bids and now recommends award of the construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder, SIERRA NATIONAL CONSTRUCTION, whose bid price is \$561,321.50.

The City Council therefore awards the contract to that bidder. All other bids are rejected.


The City Council directs the City Clerk to publish a notice of award of contract.

NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that 2:00 o'clock plm. on Tuesday, <u>August 18, 1998</u>, at the regular meeting place of the Council, City Council Chambers, 2nd Floor, Sacramento City Hall, 915 I Street, Sacramento, California 95814, has been fixed by the Council as the time and place for a public hearing of protests to the maintenance of said public improvements, to the extent of said assessment district and to the levy of said assessment, and that any interested person may object to the maintenance of said public improvements, or to the extent of said assessment district or to the levy of said assessment by filing a written protest with the City Clerk of the City at or before the time set for said public hearing, and all mailed protests should be addressed to the City Clerk, Sacramento City Hall, 915 I Street, Room 304, Sacramento, California 95814. Each protest must contain a description of the property in which each signer thereof is interested sufficient to identify the property and, if the signers are not shown on the last equalized assessment roll as the owners of the property, must contain or be accompanied by written evidence that the signers are the owners of such property. The City Clerk of the City shall endorse on each protest the date of its receipt and at the time appointed for said hearing shall present to the Council all protests filed with her.

NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that the total estimated cost of the maintenance of said public improvements is <u>\$9,350</u>, which is proposed to be met by the levy of said assessment in said proceedings for fiscal year 1999/2000.

NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that the basis on which the amount of such proposed assessment was calculated is more particularly set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

In the event that ballots in opposition exceed ballots in support, there will be a "majority protest", and the City Council will be precluded from proceeding with the proposed assessment. THIS MEASURE OF MAJORITY PROTEST IS COMPLETELY INDEPENDENT OF THE WRITTEN PROTEST PROCEDURE, WHICH IS DESCRIBED ABOVE.

EXHIBIT A

ANNEXATION TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD LANDSCAPING DISTRICT

The maintenance for this annexation to the Neighborhood Landscaping District for the Rivergate Subdivision is briefly described as follows:

Furnish all tools, equipment, apparatus, facilities, labor, material, supplies, and utilities necessary or desirable to maintain and service the landscape improvements adjacent to the Rivergate Subdivision, and more particularly described on plans and specifications approved by the City of Sacramento on file at the City of Sacramento, Department of Neighborhoods, Planning and Development Services, 1231 "I" Street, Room 400, Sacramento, California 95814.

The improvements generally consist of masonry walls, and landscaping and irrigation systems for the landscape area adjacent to the Rivergate Subdivision. Maintenance of said improvements will include, but not be limited to, periodic mowing of grass, trimming of trees and shrubs, and fertilizing, together with the regular furnishing of water for irrigation of all plant material, and the repair, maintenance and replacement of the irrigation system, planted materials and amenities. Maintenance of masonry walls includes periodic repair as required.

EXHIBIT B ANNEXATION NO. 14 TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD LANDSCAPING DISTRICT ASSESSMENT METHODOLOGY

All new subdivisions within the City of Sacramento that build landscaped areas and/or a decorative wall that benefit their subdivision are required to join a maintenance district to maintain those improvements. These landscaped areas and/or walls are built as a buffer between public rights-of-way and residential lots. Each lot benefits in the same manner and degree from the increased value and salability generated by maintaining the improvements in a reasonable manner. These areas are also built to enhance salability and property values to the residential lots within their subdivision, and therefore each lot will benefit equally from the improvements. The following action describes the proposed method of assessing the annual maintenance costs for the Annexation to the Neighborhood Landscaping District to each parcel in the district in relation to the amount of benefit received. Since each residential parcel receives the same benefit, the costs for this district are assessed to each residential parcel within the district boundary.

The costs of maintenance, more specifically described in Exhibit B to this report, will be spread equally to all residential parcels within the district.

The cost of all incidental expenses, including preparation of Engineer's Report, annual proceedings and district administration, will be spread equally to all residential parcels within the district.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

WILLOWCREEK MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 98-03

MICHAEL KASHIWAGI, Engineer of Work for Willowcreek Maintenance Assessment District No. 98-03, City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of California, makes this report, as directed by the City Council pursuant to Chapter 81 of the Sacramento City Code.

The improvement maintenance work, which is the subject of this report (hereafter referred to as the "work") is briefly described in three parts as follows:

Part #1:

The work described herein is to be carried out at Storm Sump 160 located within the boundaries of the Willowcreek Assessment District No. 94-03 recorded on March 17, 1995, in Book 80 of Maps of Assessment Districts and Community Facilities District at Page 26 in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California:

The work to be performed consists of furnishing all tools, equipment, apparatus, facilities, labor, material, supplies, and utilities necessary or desirable to provide inspections and water quality and sediment sampling and analysis.

Part #2

The work described herein is to be carried out at Storm Sump 160, the storm drainage manholes, inlets and pipes in Orchard Lane/River Plaza Drive from its northerly intersection of the Natomas Main Drainage Canal to a point approximately 1,700 feet south of its intersection of West El Camino Avenue, Unity Way, Road "A", Road "B" all located within the Willowcreek Assessment District No. 94-03 and the roadways within the Rivergate Subdivision located within the Willowcreek Maintenance Assessment District No. 98-03:

The work to be performed consists of furnishing all tools, equipment, apparatus, facilities, labor, material, supplies, and utilities necessary or desirable to remove sediment and other debris from the storm drainage system. 


